


Ecclessiastes 10: 8-20


He who digs a pit will fall into it, and whoever breaks through a wall will be bitten by a serpent. ⁹ He who quarries stones may be hurt by them, and he who splits wood may be endangered by it. ¹⁰ If the axe is dull, and one does not sharpen the edge, then he must use more strength; but wisdom brings success. ¹¹ A serpent may bite when it is not charmed; the babbler is no different. ¹² The words of a wise man's mouth are gracious, but the lips of a fool shall swallow him up; ¹³ The words of his mouth begin







Introduction


Wisdom is not hidden or mystical

²⁰ Wisdom calls aloud outside; she raises her voice in the open squares. ²¹ She cries out in the chief concourses, at the openings of the gates in the city She speaks her words: ²² "How long, you simple ones, will you love simplicity? For scorners delight in their scorning, and fools hate knowledge.²³ Turn at my rebuke; surely I will pour out my spirit on you; I will make my words known to you.



































2) Words: Edifying in words


² All of us often make mistakes. But if a person never makes a mistake in what he says, he is perfect and is also able to control his whole being. ⁴ Or think of a ship: big as it is and driven by such strong winds, it can be steered by a very small rudder, and it goes wherever the pilot wants it to go.⁵ So it is with the tongue: small as it is, it can boast about great things. Just think how large a forest can be set on fire by a tiny flame! ⁶ And the tongue is like a fire. It is a world of wrong, occupying its place in our bodies and spreading evil through our whole being. It sets on


2) Words: Edifying in words

fire the entire course of our existence with the fire that comes to it from hell itself. ⁷ We humans are able to tame and have tamed all other creatures—wild animals and birds, reptiles and fish. ⁸ But no one has ever been able to tame the tongue. It is evil and uncontrollable, full of deadly poison. ⁹ We use it to give thanks to our Lord and Father and also to curse other people, who are created in the likeness of God. ¹⁰ Words of thanksgiving and cursing pour out from the same mouth. My friends, this should not happen!

For strength and not for drunkenness! (Life value and political philosophy)





3) World: Engaging the world

4) Walk: Effective walk

¹⁸ Because of laziness the building decays, and through idleness of hands the house leaks (Stewardship of maintenance)

¹⁹ A feast is made for laughter, and wine makes merry; but money answers everything (Stewardship of money)

²⁰ Do not curse the king, even in your thought; do not curse the rich, even in your bedroom (Stewardship of the mouth)

- Firstly consider the stewardship of maintenance
- Have a robust maintenance culture for yourself (health, house and household)
