Wessage Summary

Spiritual Objective: To move from carnality to spirituality as the driving force of our lives.

Introduction

Key definitions:

Carnality - when we behave according to our sinful/fleshly nature Spirituality - when we have total dependence on the Lord

From Romans 1: 16-17, SP exhorted the need to know the righteousness of God and live righteously by faith. Defining the righteousness of God in 3 aspects of Right Standing, Believing, and Living/Actions, we realize that to capture such aspects require a total dependency on the Lord, and never on our own flesh and carnality.

SP called out for us to ask God for revelation regarding our own flesh and carnality, and then to develop faith to live out righteousness in spirituality.

Justification - Recognizing the beginning of our spiritual journey with the Lord.

The spiritual struggle between the self or the ways of the world to that of the ways of the Lord exists because our new life in Christ (spirituality) is opposed to our old life of the flesh (carnality).

It is important to note that Justification means we are accepted by God fully in 'sonship' (Romans 8:15-16) the <u>moment</u> we receive Christ as Lord and Saviour. We are freed from our old life dependent on the flesh to that of new life in the Lord (2 Corinthians 5:17). We then need to live our lives by faith in God (Galatians 2:20) and ask for the Holy Spirit to enable and empower us to do so. Justification does not mean our spirituality is whole and complete however - our old life will constantly be in tension with our new life (Galatians 5:17), and from this struggle we grow in <u>spiritual maturity</u> to become more like Christ Jesus.

Therefore, Justification is merely the very beginning of our spiritual journey with the Lord. SP used the 'Already, but Not Yet' framework to describe our constant struggle to deny the self and follow Christ. For example: we know we are saved, yet we are still <u>being saved</u> as we daily deny the urges of the flesh or lures of the world to focus on living righteously for Christ.

Sanctification - Our walking and service unto God.

As Justification is the beginning of our spiritual journey with the Lord in knowing that we have new life in Him, Sanctification builds on that foundation, recognizing that we need to continually draw closer to the Lord.

Sanctification is solidly based on our Justification, and never the other way around, which would lead to the incorrect performance-treadmill or value-of-works-alone mentalities. It is entirely due to the mercy and grace of God that our Justification and Sanctification is possible.

Moving away from carnality, growth through spirituality.

Understanding Justification and Sanctification, we can now greater appreciate our struggle between carnality and spirituality. While we may have Justification in Christ, we can still be very much 'mere infants in Christ' (carnal); spiritually immature (1 Corinthians 3:1-5). The source of such carnal living is dependency on the self, which results in our sinful nature directing our lives. We are enslaved still to sin (Romans 7:14).

We need to focus our eyes on Jesus, and live as Christ wishes us to in sanctification, yielding and having our lives directed by the Holy Spirit. In walking in the Spirit, we can overcome our old life, as we "will not gratify the desires of the flesh" (Galatians 5:16). Sanctification is a progressive and continuous process in which we need to pursue in our spiritual journey with the Lord.

The carnal being vs the spiritual being.

While we may be believers, if we are still living our old life of carnality, our minds are natural and corrupt. However, the mind of the spiritual believer is renewed and receives revelation. During Jesus' healing ministry of the blind, the people who were being healed were often asked to enact their faith, showing that the mind was indeed "governed by the Spirit" and could be filled with "life and peace" (Romans 8:5-11).

The more we pursue sanctification, the more we move away from the carnality of natural and corrupt emotion to that of Spirit-led emotion, exhibiting such fruit more and more.

The will of the carnal believer is also vastly different from that of the spiritual believer. The former has a will which is neutral and unenlightened, whereas the will of the spiritual believer is aligned with the Father-God (Colossians 1:9-11)

Spirit, Soul, Body.. which is dominant?

The believer is a 3-part being: Spirit, Soul, and Body, each interlinked. The relationship between the 3 is wholesome and Spirit-directed for the spiritual believer: The Spirit is the directing force: aligned to the Lord, thus enabling discernment and perception of His Will in our lives. From there our Soul feeds off the Spirit, which being nourished in alignment with the Lord, gives us renewed minds, emotions, and wills. Our Body can then exist in this world in a way that pleases the Lord, by being a Light to the community, having healthy relationships, etc.

For the carnal believer, the life is Body-directed. Bodily senses affect the mind, emotion, and will. Having a life led in a natural and worldly nature, a disconnection then exists between the Body-directed believer and the Lord, hence leaving the carnal believer bereft

of a Spirit-filled and sanctified life.

Conclusion

Moving from carnality to spirituality is a journey of faith, one in which the Holy Spirit enables and empowers us. Romans 8:1-2 reminds us that we are "free from the law of sin and death", and as such should continue to grow spiritually and "work out our salvation" as "God works in you to will and to act" (Philippians 2:12-13).
