
1 Corinthians 1:30 But of Him you are in Christ Jesus, who became for us wisdom from God and righteousness and sanctification and redemption—

Reign in Life

with Christ Jesus as our Righteousness

What does this mean?

What are the implications for living and reigning?



1. We have right **Standing** with God.

Romans 5:1

Therefore, having been justified by faith, we have **peace with God** through our Lord Jesus Christ

2. This righteousness is the Righteousness of **God**.

2 Corinthians 5:21

For He made Him who knew no sin to be sin for us, that we might become the righteousness of God in Him.

3. This righteousness is a **Gift** imputed to those who **Believe**.

Romans 4:3 - 5

³For what does the Scripture say?

"Abraham **believed** God, and it was **accounted** to him for **righteousness**."

Romans 4:3 - 5

⁴Now to him who works, the wages are not counted as grace but as debt. 5But to him who does not work but believes on Him who justifies the ungodly, his faith is accounted for righteousness



- You have insufficient funds.
- Someone heard of your needs and deposited the money into your account.

e.g. Paying Mortgage Installments

- You now have the funds to make your mortgage payments.
- · Similarly, God placed righteousness on Abraham's account because Abraham's righteousness was not enough to save him.

e.g. Paying Mortgage Installments

- For God to place righteousness on a person's account is justification.
- Justification is the act of God whereby He <u>acquits a believer</u> of the verdict of condemnation and declares him to be <u>righteous</u>.

This righteousness is received by <u>Faith</u> and <u>Confessing</u> Jesus Christ as Saviour and Lord.

Romans 10:9 - 10

9that if you confess with your mouth the Lord Jesus and believe in your heart that God has raised Him from the dead, you will be saved.

This righteousness is received by <u>Faith</u> and <u>Confessing</u> Jesus Christ as Saviour and Lord.

Romans 10:9 - 10

¹⁰For with the heart one believes unto righteousness, and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation.

5. This righteousness is entirely due to **Mercy** and **Grace** of God.

Ephesians 2:8 - 9

*For by grace you have been saved through faith, and that not of yourselves; it is the gift of God, *not of works, lest anyone should boast.

Romans_{10:3}

For they being ignorant of God's righteousness, and seeking to establish their own righteousness,

have not submitted to the righteousness of God.

Philippians 3:9 and be found in Him, not having my own righteousness, which is from the law, but that which is through faith in Christ, the righteousness which is from God by faith

6. This righteousness is received **Only** by **Faith** in Christ and not by any **Works** of the law.

Galatians 2:16

knowing that a man is not justified by the works of the law but by faith in Jesus Christ, even we have believed in Christ Jesus, that we might be justified by faith in Christ and not by the works of the law; for by the works of the law no flesh shall be justified.

Galatians 3:10

For as many as are of the works of the law are under the curse; for it is written, "Cursed is everyone who does not continue in all things which are written in the book of the law, to do them."

James 2:10

For whoever shall keep the whole law, and yet stumble in one point, he is guilty of all.

But that no one is justified by the law in the sight of God is evident, for "the just shall live by faith."

- 7. The principle of **Grace** guarantees the eternal security of our salvation.
 - We are saved by grace.
 - We continue in our Christian living also by grace.
 - We do not lose our salvation when we fall due to our human frailty.

- 7. The principle of **Grace** guarantees the eternal security of our salvation.
 - ✓ If that were true, God will stop dealing with us by grace and start dealing with us by law.
 - That will mean no one can keep their salvation because we all sin.

e.g. The Life of David

He committed 2 major sins:-

A. Adultery : 2 Samuel 11:1 - 5

B. Murder : 2 Samuel 11:14 - 17

e.g. The Life of David

He committed 2 major sins:-

At this point in **David's life**, he was already saved.

Did he lose his salvation because of these great sins? NO

II. Seek His Righteousness.

Matthew 6:33

But seek **first** the kingdom of God and **His righteousness**, and all these things shall be added to you.

- II. Seek His Righteousness.
 - This means we seek <u>His</u> Righteousness as <u>our</u> righteousness
 - i.e. consciously know we have <u>Right</u>

 <u>Standing With God Always</u>.

- II. Seek His Righteousness.
 - With right standing i.e. Christ Jesus as our Righteousness, Christian living is about learning to <u>Believe</u> and <u>Receive</u> His <u>Grace</u> for our daily needs.

Hebrews 4:16 (NIV)

Let us then approach the throne of grace with confidence, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help us in our time of need.

 - 3. When we do so, this is the key to the <u>Provision</u> of all our needs in life.

 - 4. This is about daily learning to **Trust** Him and **Acknowledge** Him in all our ways.

Proverbs 3:5 - 6

⁵Trust in the LORD with all your heart, and lean not on your own understanding; ⁶In all your ways acknowledge Him, and He shall direct your paths.

 - 5. This is about living our lives in total Dependency on the Lord.

John 6:68

... "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life.

 - 6. As we do so, we will experience **Peace** and **Joy** in the Holy Spirit.

Romans 14:17

for the kingdom of God is not eating and drinking, but righteousness and peace and joy in the Holy Spirit.

Romans 8:6b

... but to be spiritually minded is life and peace.

Loving Righteousness means:

- 1. Grow in **Love** with the Lord Jesus.
 - We will desire to please Him.
 - Obedience to God's Word is love-based.

Loving Righteousness means:

- We will desire the **better** thing.
- We will grow in holiness
 - i.e. in separation from the things that defiles and corrupts to the things that edify us and pleases God.

Loving Righteousness means:

2. **Sharing** His Love with others.

For we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand that we should walk in them.

2. You are a believer but live under

Condemnation.

2 reasons:-

A. You are **Ignorant** of your position in Christ:-**Revelation 12:10** - the evil one takes advantage of your ignorance and cause to live in defeat

1 John 3:20 - 22

- ²⁰For if <u>our heart condemns us</u>, <u>God is greater</u> than our heart, and knows all things.
- ²¹Beloved, if <u>our heart does not condemn us</u>, we have <u>confidence toward God</u>.
 - ²²And whatever we ask we receive from Him, because we keep His commandments and do those things that are pleasing in His sight.

2. You are a believer but live under

- 2 reasons:-
- B. You are living in **Disobedience** to God just like Joshua, the high priest in Zech 3.

¹Then he showed me Joshua the high priest standing before the Angel of the LORD, and Satan standing at his right hand to oppose him. ²And the LORD said to Satan, "The LORD rebuke you, Satan! The LORD who has chosen Jerusalem rebuke you! Is this not a brand plucked from the fire?"

³Now Joshua was **clothed with filthy** garments, and was standing before the Angel. ⁴Then He answered and spoke to those who stood before Him, saying, "Take away the filthy garments from him." And to him He said, "See, I have removed your iniquity from you, and I will clothe you with rich robes."

⁵And I said, "Let them put a <u>clean turban</u> on his head." So they put a clean turban on his head, and they put the <u>[clean] clothes</u> on him. And the Angel of the LORD stood by.

⁶Then the Angel of the LORD <u>admonished</u> Joshua, saying,

7"Thus says the LORD of hosts: 'If you will walk in My ways, and if you will keep My command, then you shall also judge My house, and likewise have charge of My courts; I will give you places to walk among these who stand here.
