


Hebrews 12:24 to <u>Jesus the Mediator</u> of the new covenant, and to the blood of sprinkling that speaks better things than that of Abel.

Hebrews 8:6 But now He has obtained a more excellent ministry, inasmuch as He is also Mediator of a better covenant, which was established on better promises.





Focus on <u>His</u> Righteousness, not <u>our</u> righteousness.

1 Corinthians 1:30 But of Him you are in Christ Jesus, who became for us <u>wisdom</u> from God—and <u>righteousness</u> and sanctification and redemption—

Christ Jesus is our Righteousness



Righteousness comprise 2 parts:

- Justification our position of right standing before God in Christ.
- II. Sanctification our journey of right living before God in Christ.



- Justification Right <u>standing</u> before God in Christ.
 - Know that in Christ, we can come to God <u>24/7/365</u>.

Romans 5: 1 Therefore, having been justified by faith, we have **peace with God** through our Lord Jesus Christ ...



This righteousness is the Righteousness of God.

2 Corinthians 5:21 For He made Him who knew no sin to be sin for us, that we might become the **righteousness of God** in Him.



3. We receive this righteousness as a gift.

Romans 4:3 For what does the Scripture say?
"Abraham believed God, and it was accounted to him for righteousness." 4 Now to him who works, the wages are not counted as grace but as debt. 5 But to him who does not work but believes on Him who justifies the ungodly, his faith is accounted for righteousness ...



 We receive this righteousness by <u>faith</u> when we <u>confess</u> Jesus Christ as Saviour and Lord.

Romans 10:9 that if you confess with your mouth the Lord Jesus and believe in your heart that God has raised Him from the dead, you will be saved. 10 For with the heart one believes unto righteousness, and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation.



 It is entirely due to the mercy and grace of God to give us this righteousness in Christ

Ephesians 2:8 For <u>by grace</u> you have been saved <u>through faith</u>, and that not of yourselves; it is the <u>gift of God</u>, 9 <u>not of works</u>, lest anyone should boast.

Romans 10:4 For Christ is the <u>end</u> of the <u>law</u> for <u>righteousness</u> to <u>everyone who believes</u>.



We cannot work to earn this righteousness.

Romans 10:3 For they being ignorant of <u>God's</u> <u>righteousness</u>, and seeking to establish their <u>own righteousness</u>, have not submitted to the righteousness of God.



6. We cannot work to earn this righteousness.

Philippians 3:9 and be found in Him, not having my own righteousness, which is from the law, but that which is through faith in Christ, the righteousness which is from God by faith ...



- II. Sanctification Right <u>living</u> before God in Christ.
 - In our daily walk, focus to be led and ruled by the Holy Spirit, not by our self-life, external laws or anything else.



- In our daily walk, focus to be led and ruled by the Holy Spirit, not by <u>our self-life</u>, external <u>laws</u> or anything else.
 - A. To be led is to be <u>ruled</u>, <u>governed</u>, <u>tutored</u> and <u>directed</u>.



Bi. Legalism is when we are ruled by rules.



Bii. Lawlessness is when we are ruled by "whatever" seems right in our own eyes without regard to the Laws of God.

Judges 21:25 In those days there was no king in Israel; everyone did what was right in his own eyes.



Biii. Lawfulness is when we are ruled by God [to fulfill the Spirit of the Law] in our relationship with Him.

Matthew 6:33 But seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things shall be added to you.



- **C.** In living the Christian life, we must know the difference between:
 - Relying on <u>our own</u> effort and strength.
 - **ii.** Relying <u>completely</u> on the Holy Spirit to enable and empower us.

Hebrews 8:10 For this is the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel after those days, says the Lord: I will **put My laws in their mind** and **write them on their hearts**; and I will be their God, and they shall be My people.



- **ii.** Relying <u>completely</u> on the Holy Spirit to enable and empower us.
 - e.g. 1 When we deal with <u>anger</u> and <u>bitterness</u> in our hearts, we will not physically murder.
 - e.g. 2 When we deal with <u>lust</u> in our hearts, we will not commit adultery.
 - e.g. 3 When we deal with <u>covetousness</u> in our hearts, we will not steal.



- **Di.** We cannot <u>mix</u> our self-righteousness with God's righteousness.
- **Dii.** There is only <u>one</u> righteousness i.e. God's
- **Diii.** It does not depend on <u>us</u>, it depends entirely on <u>Jesus</u> who is our Sanctifier.

Romans 10:4 For Christ is the end of the law for righteousness to everyone who believes.



- **Div.** When Christ is our Sanctifier, we move from
 - (a) Being tutored or ruled by our self-life, external laws or anything else.

to

(b) Being tutored - ruled - led and empowered only by the <u>Holy</u> Spirit.



- 2. Focus on the super abundant grace in Christ, not on our level of faith.
 - A. From God's perspective, He has already given us <u>all</u> the faith for <u>all</u> the needs in our lives.



B. From the believer's perspective, our faith "grows" as we journey in revelation and experience with God.



2 Peter 1:2 Grace and peace be multiplied to you in the knowledge of God and of Jesus our Lord, 3 as His divine power has given to us all things that pertain to life and godliness, through the knowledge of Him who called us by glory and virtue, 4 by which have been given to us exceedingly great and precious promises, that through these you may be partakers of the divine nature, having escaped the corruption that is in the world through lust.





C. See the super abundant grace available to the believer in the Divine Exchange in Christ.

Romans 5:1 Therefore, having been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, 2 through whom also we have access by faith into this grace in which we stand, and rejoice in hope of the glory of God.

C. See the super abundant grace available to the believer in the <u>Divine Exchange</u> in Christ.
 John 16:33 These things I have spoken to you, that in <u>Me you may have peace</u>. In the world

you will have tribulation; but be of good cheer,

I have overcome the world."



D. Appropriate the Divine Exchange by the **Spirit of Faith**.

2 Corinthians 1:20 (NIV) For no matter how many promises God has made, they are "Yes" in Christ. And so through him the "Amen" is spoken by us to the glory of God.

2 Corinthians 4:13 And since we have the same spirit of faith, according to what is written, "I believed and therefore I spoke," we also believe and therefore speak...



Focus on God's love for <u>me</u> and not <u>my</u> love for Him.

John 3:16 For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life.



Focus on God's love for <u>me</u> and not <u>my</u> love for Him.

1 John 3:1 Behold what manner of love the Father has bestowed on us, that we should be called children of God! Therefore the world does not know us, because it did not know Him.



Focus on God's love for me and not my love for Him.

1 John 4:16 And we have known and believed the love that God has for us ...

1 John 4:19 We love Him because <u>He first</u> loved us.



 Focus on God's love for <u>me</u> and not <u>my</u> love for Him.

Romans 5:5 Now hope does not disappoint, because the <u>love of God</u> has been <u>poured out in our hearts</u> by the Holy Spirit who was given to us.



Focus on the <u>one</u> thing that is needful <u>first</u> and then we will know the <u>priority</u> of the <u>many</u> things to do.

Luke 18:22 So when Jesus heard these things, He said to him [Rich Young Ruler], "You still <u>lack one thing</u>. Sell all that you have and distribute to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; and come, follow Me."



4. Focus on the <u>one</u> thing that is needful <u>first</u> and then we will know the <u>priority</u> of the <u>many</u> things to do.

Psalm 27:3 Though an army may encamp against me, my heart shall not fear; though war may rise against me, in this I will be confident.

4 One thing I have desired of the Lord, that will I seek: that I may dwell in the house of the Lord all the days of my life, to behold the beauty of the Lord, and to inquire in His temple.

Luke 10:42 But one thing is needed, and Mary has chosen that good part, which will not be taken away from her.
