 Consequently, we must be <u>reconciled</u> with God. To be <u>reconciled</u> with God means to have: <u>Right standing</u> with God This is called: <u>Righteousness</u> 2. Consequently, we must be <u>reconciled</u> with God.

Romans 5:1

Therefore, having been **justified by faith**, we have **peace with God** through our Lord Jesus Christ 2. Consequently, we must be **reconciled** with God.

2 Corinthians 5:18-19

18Now all things are of God, who has **reconciled** us to Himself through Jesus Christ, and has given us the **ministry of reconciliation**, 19that is, that God was in Christ **reconciling** the world to Himself, not imputing their trespasses to them, and has committed to us the **word of reconciliation**.

This is realizing our helplessness and hopelessness and relying totally on the mercy and grace of God to save us.

1Then Jesus entered and passed through Jericho.2Now behold, there was a man named Zacchaeus who was a chief tax collector, and he was rich.3And he sought to see who Jesus was, but could not because of the crowd, for he was of short stature.

Romans 10:3-4

3For they being ignorant of **God's righteousness**, and seeking to establish their **own righteousness**, have not submitted to the righteousness of God. 4For **Christ is the end of the law for righteousness to everyone who believes**.

Romans 3:22, 24 22even the righteousness of God, through faith in Jesus Christ, to all and on all who believe. For there is no difference 24being justified freely by His grace through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus 4. We need the <u>Grace</u> of the <u>Righteousness of God</u> by <u>faith</u>.

Romans 3:27-28

27Where is boasting then? It is excluded. By what law? Of works? No, but by the law of faith. 28Therefore we conclude that a man is justified by faith apart from the deeds of the law. 4. We need the <u>Grace</u> of the <u>Righteousness of God</u> by <u>faith</u>.

Romans 1:17

For in it [Gospel] the **righteousness of God** is revealed from **faith to faith**; as it is written, "The just shall **live by faith**." 5. **<u>Receive</u>** the Good News of great joy.

Romans 6:23

For the wages of sin is death, but the **gift of God** is **eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord**.

5. **<u>Receive</u>** the Good News of great joy.

Ephesians 2:8-9 8For by grace you have been saved through faith, and that not of yourselves; it is the gift of God, 9not of works, lest anyone should boast. 5. <u>Receive</u> the Good News of great joy.

Romans 5:9-10 9Much more then, having now been justified by His blood, we shall be saved from wrath through Him. 10For if when we were enemies we were reconciled to God through the death of His Son, much more, having been reconciled, we shall be saved by His life.

5. **Receive** the Good News of great joy.

2 Corinthians 5:21

For He made Him who knew no sin to be sin for us, that **we** might **become the righteousness** of God in Him.

I am the righteousness of God in Christ Jesus! 5. **<u>Receive</u>** the Good News of great joy.

Romans 5:17b

... much more those who receive **abundance** of grace and of the gift of righteousness will reign in life through the One, Jesus Christ.
