The Trial of our **FAITH**

- 1. The believer's faith is a <u>mixture</u>.
 - B. But, the other portion of our faith comprise <u>impurities</u> that are <u>not</u> aligned with the Will, Word, Ways and Wisdom of God.



The Trial of our FAITH

2A. Impurities in gold are purified by <u>fire</u>.
2B. Similarly, <u>trials</u> in our lives, like fire, purifies our faith.

The Trial of our FAITH

 Trials are <u>grievous</u> / <u>painful</u> to the person undergoing it.

1 Peter 1:6 In this you greatly rejoice, though now for a little while, if need be, you have been <u>grieved</u> by <u>various trials</u>, 7 that the <u>genuineness of your faith</u>, being much more precious than gold that perishes, though it is <u>tested by fire</u>, may be found to praise, honor, and glory at the revelation of Jesus Christ ...

The Trial of our FAITH

2E. Trials are only as <u>needed</u>, and seem to attract those whose faith are not genuine.

1 Peter 1:6 In this you greatly rejoice, though now for a little while, <u>if need be</u>, you have been <u>grieved by various</u> <u>trials</u>, 7 that the <u>genuineness of your faith</u>, being much more precious than gold that perishes, though it is <u>tested by fire</u>, may be found to praise, honor, and glory at the revelation of Jesus Christ ...



2F. The genuineness of our faith will see us through to the <u>end</u> of our lives when we meet the Lord.

The Trial of our FAITH

3B. There will be situations where we will <u>not</u> completely know and understand on this side of heaven.

1 Corinthians 13:9 For we <u>know in part</u> and we prophesy in part.

1 Corinthians 13:12 For now we see in a mirror, dimly, but then face to face. Now I <u>know in part</u>, but then I shall know just as I also am known.



The Trial of our FAITH

3C. But, God has given us <u>sufficient</u> knowledge in His <u>Word</u> and <u>Revelation</u> from the Holy Spirit when we seek Him.



The Trial of our **FAITH**

 Sufficient knowledge from God's Word and revelation by the Holy Spirit will help to <u>purify</u> our faith.

The Trial of our FAITH

- 4B. It will help answer such questions:
 - i. Why did this accident happen to me?
 - ii. Did God send the typhoon-tsunami to judge us?
 - iii. Did God give me <u>cancer</u> to punish me or to teach me godliness?
 - iv. Why did God not answer my prayer?
 - v. Why is it so unfair to me?
 - vi. Why? Why? Why?

4C. Sufficient knowledge from God's Word require us to always base a principle or truth on the <u>entire weight</u> of Scriptures instead of some portion that seems to say otherwise.

Psalm 119:160

the entirety / sum of the scriptures is truth.



The Trial of our **FAITH**

4D. Understand that God will not allow a trial beyond our ability to overcome, does <u>not</u> mean God caused it.

1 Corinthians 10:13 (NKJV) No temptation has overtaken you except such as is common to man; but God is faithful, who will <u>not allow you to be tempted beyond</u> <u>what you are able</u>, but with the temptation will also make the way of escape, that you may be able to bear it.



1 Corinthians 10:13 (AMP)

For no temptation (no trial regarded as enticing to sin), [no matter how it comes or where it leads] has overtaken you and laid hold on you that is not common to man [that is, no temptation or trial has come to you that is beyond human resistance and that is not adjusted and adapted and belonging to human experience, and such as man can bear]. But God is faithful [to His Word and to His compassionate nature], and He [can be trusted] not to let you be tempted and tried and assayed beyond your ability and strength of resistance and power to endure, but with the temptation He will [always] also provide the way out (the means of escape to a landing place), that you may be capable and strong and powerful to bear up under it patiently.

The Trial of our FAITH

Romans 3:23 for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God.

John 16:33 These things I have spoken to you, that in Me you may have peace. In the world you will have tribulation; but be of good cheer, I have overcome the world.



The Trial of our FAITH

1 Peter 2:20 For what credit is it if, when you are beaten for your faults, you take it patiently? But when you do good and suffer, if you take it patiently, this is commendable before God.

The Trial of our FAITH

2 Corinthians 12:9 And He said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for My <u>strength is made perfect</u> in weakness." Therefore most gladly I will rather boast in my infirmities, that the power of Christ may rest upon me.



The Trial of our FAITH

- The trial of the believer's faith may result in 2 broad outcomes:
 - **B.** Turning to God to seek His grace for the trial.

Hebrews 12:2 (NIV) Let us fix our eyes on Jesus, the author and <u>perfecter of our faith</u>, who for the joy set before him endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God.

Romans 5:3 And not only that, but we also glory in tribulations, knowing that tribulation produces perseverance ...



The Trial of our FAITH

When the believer <u>connects</u> with God during the trial.
 A. He will develop strength in <u>perseverance</u>.

James 1:3 knowing that the testing of your faith produces patience - perseverance.



The Trial of our FAITH

8. When the believer <u>connects</u> with God during the trial

- B. He will develop the character of Christ.
 - i. Faith focuses on <u>God</u>, not our problems.
 - ii. Faith trust in God's <u>timing</u>, not our own.
 - Faith grows by <u>believing</u> God in spite of our circumstances.
 - iv. Faith obeys God one step at a time.

Romans 5:4a and perseverance, character ...

The Trial of our FAITH

When the believer <u>connects</u> with God during the trial.
 C. He will have <u>hope</u>.

Romans 5:4b ... and character, hope.

When the believer <u>connects</u> with God during the trial.
 D. He will experience the deep assurance of the <u>love</u> of God.

Romans 5:5 Now hope does not disappoint, because the love of God has been poured out in our hearts by the Holy Spirit who was given to us.



The Trial of our FAITH

When the believer <u>connects</u> with God during the trial.
 E. He will be <u>victorious</u> i.e. an <u>overcomer</u>.

James 1:4 But let patience have its perfect work, that you may be <u>perfect and complete</u>, <u>lacking nothing</u>.



The Trial of our FAITH

When the believer <u>connects</u> with God during the trial.
 E. He will be <u>victorious</u> i.e. an <u>overcomer</u>.

Romans 8:28 And we know that all things work together for good to those who love God, to those who are the called according to His purpose.

Genesis 50:20 But as for you, you meant evil against me; but God meant it for good, in order to bring it about as it is this day, to save many people alive.



The Trial of our FAITH

When the believer <u>connects</u> with God during the trial.
 F. He can now <u>minister</u> to others the Grace of God.

2 Corinthians 1:3 Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of mercies and God of all comfort,
4 who comforts us in all our tribulation, that we may be able to comfort those who are in any trouble, with the comfort with which we ourselves are comforted by God.
