God is Holy.

All who come before Him must be holy too.
That means that the sins of man
must be covered / atoned for in order
for man to have relationship with God.
This is a law of life from the very beginning
A life to cover another life.

Leviticus 17:11

For the life of a creature is in the blood, and I have given it to you to make atonement for yourselves on the altar; it is the blood that makes atonement for one's life.

Throughout scriptures from Genesis to Revelation, God requires that Blood be shed to cover man's sin in order for man to have relationship with Him. God established this Blood Covenant from the very beginning.

Genesis 3:7 – 11

Then the eyes of both of them were opened, and they knew that they were naked; and they sewed fig leaves together and made themselves coverings.

⁸And they heard the sound of the LORD God walking in the garden in the cool of the day, and Adam and his wife <u>hid themselves from</u> the Presence of the LORD God among the trees of the garden.

11And He said, "Who told you that you were naked? Have you eaten from the tree of which I commanded you that you should not eat?"


Genesis 3:21


... for Adam and his wife the LORD God made tunics of skin, and clothed them.

Tunics / Coats of Skin
This is from the slain animal
i.e. Blood is shed.

The covering for man is <u>NOT</u> from leaves of plants or cloths.

It is from the skin of a slain animal.





The Blood Covenant and Abel Adam taught both his sons, Cain and Abel the Blood Covenant But only Abel heeded the instruction Genesis 4:4 Abel also brought of the firstborn of his flock and of their fat. And the LORD respected Abel and his offering.

The Blood Covenant and Abel

Hebrews 11:4
By faith Abel offered to God
a more excellent sacrifice than Cain,
through which he obtained
witness that he was righteous.

The Blood Covenant and Noah

Genesis 7:1 – 2

¹Then the LORD said to Noah,

"Come into the ark, you and all
your household, because
I have seen that you are righteous
before Me in this generation.



The Blood Covenant and Noah

Genesis 7:1 – 2

²You shall take with you <u>seven</u> each of every <u>clean</u> animal, a male and his female; <u>two</u> each of animals that are <u>unclean</u>, a male and his female

There were thousands of clean animals

Genesis 8:18,20

¹⁸So Noah went out, and his sons and his wife and his sons' wives with him. ²⁰Then Noah <u>built an altar to the LORD</u>, and took of every <u>clean</u> animal and of every clean bird, and <u>offered burnt</u> offerings on the altar.

Genesis 8:21

And the LORD smelled a soothing aroma. Then the LORD said in His heart, "I will never again curse the ground for man's sake, although the imagination of man's heart is evil from his youth; nor will I again destroy every living thing as I have done.

He baptized the earth with blood in order for the earth to be freed from the curse.

The LORD saw and smelled the blood sacrifice and removed the curse.

Genesis 8:22
While the earth remains,
seedtime and harvest, cold and heat,
winter and summer, and day and night
shall not cease."

Genesis 12:1
Now the LORD had said to Abram:
"Get out of your country, from your family and from your father's house, to a land that I will show you.

Genesis 12:7

... And there he built an altar to the LORD, who had appeared to him.

The first thing Abram did was not to build a tent [verse 8 later], but an altar to the LORD.

He understood the Blood Covenant

The Blood Covenant and Isaac

Genesis 26:24 – 25

²⁴And the LORD appeared to him the same night and said, "I am the God of your father Abraham; do not fear, for I am with you. I will bless you and multiply your descendants for My servant Abraham's sake."

The LORD gave His Promise to Isaac

The Blood Covenant and Isaac

Genesis 26:24 – 25
²⁵So he <u>built an altar</u> there and called on the Name of the LORD, and he pitched his tent there ...

Again, the first thing Isaac did was to apply the Blood Covenant

The Blood Covenant and Jacob

Genesis 35:1

Then God said to Jacob, "Arise, go up to Bethel and dwell there; and make an <u>altar</u> there to God, who appeared to you when you fled from the face of Esau your brother."

The Blood Covenant and Jacob

Genesis 35:7

And he <u>built an altar there</u> [Bethel] and called the place El Bethel, because there God appeared to him when he fled from the face of his brother.

In Genesis, only the righteous applied the Blood

Not so with:-

* Cain

* Ishmael

* Esau ...

For the next 430 years The Children of Israel forgot the Blood Covenant They were in slavery They even forgot the Name of their God

Exodus 3:13 ¹³Then Moses said to God, "Indeed, when I come to the children of Israel and say to them, 'The God of your fathers has sent me to you,' and they say to me, 'What is His name?' what shall I say to them?"

Exodus 3:13 – 15 ¹⁴And God said to Moses, "I AM WHO I AM." ... 'The LORD God of your fathers, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob, has sent me to you. This is My Name forever, and this is My memorial to all generations.'

The Promise was given to Moses because of the Blood Covenant the LORD made with the fathers

The LORD revealed the Blood Covenant to Moses & Israel

To receive His Salvation

Deliverance and Blessing

The Blood Covenant and the Passover

Moses

Exodus 12:7

And they shall take some of the blood and put it on the two doorposts and on the lintel of the houses where they eat it.

Exodus 12:23 For the LORD will pass through to strike the Egyptians; and when He sees the blood on the lintel and on the two doorposts, the LORD will pass over the door and not allow the destroyer to come into your houses to strike you.

The Blood Covenant and the Passover The Blood kept Israel alive - 3 m people Israel applied the Blood, they were then freed, delivered and plundered the Egyptians The Blood protected Israel from the destroyer ... from death The LORD will not allow demons to attack His people under the Blood

1500 Years later

The Blood Covenant – the New Covenant

John 1:29

The next day John saw Jesus coming toward him, and said, "Behold!
The Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world!"

The Blood Covenant was re-introduced to Israel

The Lord Jesus Christ

John 3:16
For God so loved the world that
He gave His only begotten Son,
that whoever believes in Him
should not perish
but have everlasting life.

The Lord Jesus Christ

He shed His Blood on 7 occasions

1. His Blood was shed in Gethsemane to redeem our <u>REBELLIOUS WILL</u>.

In Gethsemane, He willingly submitted to the will of the Father to go to the Cross.

Our rebellious will can then be enlightened to make correct wise decisions in life.

2. His Blood was shed when He was whipped for our HEALING.

With His Stripes, we are healed.

His Blood was shed to redeem us from the curse of <u>sickness and disease</u> which came as a consequence of our sins.

He IS our Healer!

3. His Blood was shed when the Crown of Thorns was placed on His Head to redeem us from the curse of POVERTY.

The Crown of Thorns indicate poverty as contrasted with a crown of jewels and precious stones which indicate royalty and wealth.

4. His Blood was shed when they nailed His Hands to redeem our <u>AUTHORITY & DOMINION</u> on this earth. (Genesis 1:26, 28)

Genesis 1:26, 28 ²⁶Then God said, "Let Us make man in Our image, according to Our likeness; let them have dominion over ... ²⁸Then God blessed them, and God said to them, "Be fruitful and multiply; fill the earth and subdue it; have dominion over the fish of the sea, over the birds of the air, and over every living thing that moves on the earth."

4. His Blood was shed when they nailed His Hands to redeem our AUTHORITY & DOMINION on this earth. (Genesis 1:26, 28) On the Cross, they declared Him as King of the Jews! Dominion over things we touch - handle lay hands on ... Psalm 8:4 -7; Mark 16:18

5. His Blood was shed when they nailed His Feet to redeem our <u>DESTINY & PURPOSE</u> in life.

Deuteronomy 11:24a
Every place on which the sole of your foot treads shall be yours ...
Otherwise, we are walking the wrong path

6. His Blood was shed when they pierced His Side to heal the BROKEN HEARTED.

John 19:34
But one of the soldiers pierced
His side with a spear, and immediately blood and water came out.

6. His Blood was shed when they pierced His Side to heal the BROKEN HEARTED.

Psalm 34:20

He guards all His bones; not one of them is broken.

There was no need to break Jesus' legs because they found He was already dead

6. His Blood was shed when they pierced His Side to heal the BROKEN HEARTED.

He had died of a broken heart. This is indicated medically.


Luke 4:18

7. His Blood was shed in His Bruises to deliver us from our **INIQUITIES**.

Bruise = Bleeding from the inside

He will deliver us and heal us from our negative and destructive behavior traits




The Lord Jesus' Blood was shed for us

- 2. He was whipped by His Stripes for our <u>healing</u>.
- 3. The Crown of Thorns was placed on His Head to redeem us from the curse of poverty.

The Lord Jesus' Blood was shed for us

- 4. His nailed hands to redeem our authority & dominion on the earth.
- 5. His nailed feet to redeem our walk destiny.
- 6. His broken heart to heal the broken-hearted.
- 7. His bruises to <u>deliver and set us free</u>.
