
# Millions Of Children also suffer from Prosperity (and spiritual poverty)

Many are now reading Scripture with - the child in the midst.


And there are many - more than 1400 references to children and childhood and related issues. (See Zuck)

Give me children or l'Il die! (Genesis 30:1)




#### **God Hears the Children Crying**

## "Now I know!" The Widow of Zerapath


- Some time later the brook dried up ...

- 12 "As surely as the LORD your God lives," she replied, "I don't have any bread—only a handful of flour in a jar and a little olive oil in a jug. I am gathering a few sticks to take home and make a meal for myself and my son, that we may eat it—and die.[!]" ...

24 Then the woman said to Elijah, "Now I know that you are a man of God and that the word of the LORD from your mouth is the truth."




# "Now I know!" Naaman's Servant Girl (2 Kings 5:1-19)

- 1 Now Naaman was commander of the army of the king of Aram. He was a great man in the sight of his master and highly regarded, ... He was a valiant soldier, but he had leprosy.
- 2 Now bands of raiders ... had taken captive a young girl from Israel, and she served Naaman's wife. 3 She said to her mistress, "If only my master would see the prophet who is in Samaria! He would cure him of his leprosy."
