- « Genesis 22 Mt Moriah the Ram.
- Noah
- * The Exodus Blood on door post.
- * At Mt Sinai Blood sprinkled on the Israelites.
- * H / H Blood on mercy seat.
- * Veil was torn at Calvary!



I. Jesus, our Passover Lamb

Exodus 12:12-13

12 'For I will pass through the land of Egypt on that night, and will strike all the firstborn in the land of Egypt, both man and beast; and against all the gods of Egypt I will execute judgment: I am the Lord. 13 Now the blood shall be a sign for you on the houses where you are. <u>And when I see the blood</u>, <u>I will pass over you</u>; and the plague shall not be on you to destroy you when I strike the land of Egypt.



1. The Passover Lamb in Exodus 12 for Israel was a type of the Lord Jesus as the Passover Lamb for the entire world.

John 1:29, 36

29 The next day John saw Jesus coming toward him, and said, "Behold! <u>The Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world</u>!
36 And looking at <u>Jesus</u> as He walked, he said, "Behold

the Lamb of God!"



1. The Passover Lamb in Exodus 12 for Israel was a type of the Lord Jesus as the Passover Lamb for the entire world.

1 Corinthians 5:7b ... For indeed <u>Christ</u>, <u>our Passover</u>, was <u>sacrificed</u> for us.

Matthew 1:21 And she will bring forth a Son, and you shall call His name <u>Jesus</u>, for He will <u>save His people</u> from their sins."



2. The Lamb of God had to be <u>killed</u> and <u>blood</u> shed for the <u>forgiveness</u> of sins.

1 Peter 1:19b ... as of a <u>lamb without blemish and</u> <u>without spot</u>.

Hebrews 9:22 And according to the law almost all things are purified with blood, and without shedding of blood there is no remission.



 The Lamb of God had to be <u>killed</u> and <u>blood</u> shed for the <u>forgiveness</u> of sins.

Ephesians 1:7 In Him we have <u>redemption through</u> <u>His blood</u>, <u>the forgiveness of sins</u>, according to the riches of His grace ...



II. The Lord's Supper

1 Corinthians 11:23b-26

23 ... that the Lord Jesus on the same night in which He was betrayed took <u>bread</u>; 24 and when He had given thanks, <u>He broke it</u> and said, "<u>Take, eat</u>; <u>this is My body</u> <u>which is broken for you</u>; <u>do this in remembrance of Me</u>."



II. The Lord's Supper

1 Corinthians 11:23b-26

25 In the same manner He also took the <u>cup</u> after supper, saying, "<u>This cup is the new covenant in My blood</u>. This <u>do</u>, as often as you <u>drink</u> it, in <u>remembrance of Me</u>."
26 For as often as you <u>eat</u> this <u>bread</u> and <u>drink</u> this <u>cup</u>, you <u>proclaim the Lord's death till He comes</u>.



1. The Bread is the Body of Christ.

1 Corinthians 11:23b-24

23 ... that the Lord Jesus on the same night in which He was betrayed took <u>bread</u>; 24 and when He had given thanks, He broke it and said, "Take, eat; <u>this is My body</u> <u>which is broken for you</u>; do this in remembrance of Me."



1. The Bread is the Body of Christ

1 John 4:2-3

2 By this you know the <u>Spirit of God</u>: Every spirit that <u>confesses that Jesus Christ has come in the flesh</u> <u>is of God</u>, 3 and every spirit that does <u>not confess that</u> <u>Jesus Christ has come in the flesh is not of God</u>. And this is the spirit of the <u>Antichrist</u>, which you have heard was coming, and is now already in the world.



- Understand the <u>purpose</u> for the <u>bodily</u> death of the Lord Jesus.
 - A. He died for our <u>salvation</u>.

Hebrews 10:10 By that will we have been <u>sanctified</u> [saved, set apart, called by Him, made holy] <u>through</u> the offering of the Body of Jesus Christ once for all.



A. He died for our salvation.

1 Corinthians 15:2-4

2 by which also you are <u>saved</u>, if you hold fast that word which I preached to you—unless you believed in vain.
3 For I delivered to you first of all that which I also received: that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, 4 and that He was buried, and that He rose again the third day according to the Scriptures ..



A. He died for our salvation.

Romans 10:9-10

9 that if you <u>confess with your mouth</u> the Lord Jesus and <u>believe in your heart</u> that God has raised Him from the dead, you <u>will be saved</u>. 10 For with the <u>heart</u> one <u>believes unto righteousness</u>, and with the <u>mouth</u> <u>confession is made unto salvation</u>.



B. He died to include us in <u>His Body</u> - the Body of Christ.

1 Corinthians 12:12-13

12 For as the <u>body is one and has many members</u>, but all the members of that one body, being many, are one body, so also is Christ. **13** For by one Spirit <u>we were all baptized</u> <u>into one body</u> —whether Jews or Greeks, whether slaves or free—and have all been made to drink into one Spirit.



B. He died to include us in <u>His Body</u> - the Body of Christ.

Romans 12:5 so we, being many, are one body in Christ, and individually members of one another.



C. He died to give us the life-giving Spirit

1 Corinthians 15:45 "The first man Adam became a living being." The last Adam (Jesus) became a life-giving spirit.



C. He died to give us the life-giving Spirit.

Ezekiel 36:26-27

26 I will give you a <u>new heart</u> and <u>put a new spirit within</u> you; I will take the heart of stone out of your flesh and give you a heart of flesh. 27 <u>I will put My Spirit within you</u> and cause you to walk in My statutes, and you will keep My judgments and do them.



C. He died to give us the life-giving Spirit.

Hebrews 8:10-11

10 For this is the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel after those days, says the Lord: I will <u>put My laws</u> <u>in their mind and write them on their hearts</u>; and I will be their God, and they shall be My people. **11** None of them shall teach his neighbour, and none his brother, saying, 'Know the Lord,' <u>for all shall know Me</u>, from the least of them to the greatest of them.



D. He died so that we may have <u>communion</u> with Him and with one another.

1 Corinthians 10:16b ... The bread which we break, is it not the **communion of the body of Christ**?

2 Corinthians 13:14 The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the <u>communion of the Holy Spirit</u> be with you all. Amen.



D. He died so that we may have <u>communion</u> with Him and with one another.

1 John 1:3 that which we have seen and heard we declare to you, that you also may have <u>fellowship with us</u>; <u>and</u> <u>truly our fellowship is with the Father and with His Son</u> <u>Jesus Christ</u>.



E. He died for our bodily healing

Matthew 8:16-17

16 When evening had come, they brought to Him many who were demon-possessed. And He cast out the spirits with a word, <u>and healed all who were sick</u>, **17** that it might be <u>fulfilled</u> which was spoken by Isaiah the prophet, saying: "<u>He Himself took our infirmities and bore our</u> <u>sicknesses</u>."



3. The Cup of wine is the Blood of Christ.

1 Corinthians 11:25 In the same manner He also took the <u>cup</u> after supper, saying, "<u>This cup is the new</u> <u>covenant in My blood</u>. This do, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me."



- 4. Understand the purpose why blood must be shed.
 - A. His Blood was shed for the <u>atonement /</u> <u>covering</u> of our sins.

Hebrews 9:22 And according to the law almost all things are purified with blood, and without shedding of blood there is no remission.

1 John 2:2 And <u>He Himself is the propitiation for</u> our sins, and not for ours only but also for the whole world.



A. His Blood was shed for the <u>atonement / covering</u> of our sins.

Hebrews 10:19-22

19 Therefore, brethren, having <u>boldness to enter the Holiest</u> by the blood of Jesus, 20 by a <u>new and living way</u> which He consecrated for us, through the veil, that is, His flesh, 21 and having a High Priest over the house of God, 22 let us <u>draw near</u> with a true heart in full assurance of faith, having our hearts sprinkled from an evil conscience and our bodies washed with pure water.



B. His Blood was shed to <u>cleanse</u> us from every defilement in our spirit and body.

Psalm 51:2, 7, 10

2 <u>Wash me</u> thoroughly from my iniquity, and <u>cleanse me</u> from my sin.

7 <u>Purge me</u> with hyssop, and I shall be clean; <u>wash me</u>, and I shall be whiter than snow.

- 10 Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew
- a steadfast spirit within me.



B. His Blood was shed to <u>cleanse</u> us from every defilement in our spirit and body.

Revelations 1:5 and from Jesus Christ, the faithful witness, the firstborn from the dead, and the ruler over the kings of the earth. To Him who loved us and <u>washed us from</u> <u>our sins in His own blood</u> ...



B. His Blood was shed to <u>cleanse</u> us from every defilement in our spirit and body.

1 John 1:9 If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to <u>forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from</u> <u>all unrighteousness</u>.

2 Corinthians 7:1 Therefore, having these promises, beloved, let us <u>cleanse ourselves from all filthiness of</u> <u>the flesh and spirit</u>, perfecting holiness in the fear of God.

B. His Blood was shed to <u>cleanse</u> us from every defilement in our spirit and body.

Hebrews 9:14 how much more shall <u>the blood of Christ</u>, who through the eternal Spirit offered Himself without spot to God, <u>cleanse your conscience from dead works</u> to serve the living God?



C. His Blood gives us life.

Leviticus 17:11 For the <u>life</u> of the flesh is <u>in the blood</u>, and I have given it to you upon the altar to <u>make atonement</u> for your souls; for <u>it is the blood that makes atonement</u> for the soul.



C. His Blood gives us life.

1 Peter 1:18-19

18 knowing that you were **not** <u>redeemed</u> with **corruptible things**, like silver or gold, from your aimless conduct received by tradition from your fathers, **19** but <u>with</u> <u>the precious blood of Christ</u>, <u>as of a lamb without</u> <u>blemish and without spot</u>.



C. His Blood gives us life.

Colossians 2:12-13

12 buried with Him in baptism, in which you also were <u>raised with Him through faith</u> in the working of God, who raised Him from the dead. 13 And <u>you</u>, <u>being dead</u> <u>in your trespasses</u> and the uncircumcision of your flesh, <u>He has made alive together with Him</u>, <u>having forgiven</u> <u>you all trespasses</u> ...



D. His Blood secures the <u>blessings</u> of the new covenant for us.

Ephesians 1:3 Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has <u>blessed us with every spiritual</u> <u>blessing</u> in the heavenly places in Christ

John 10:10b ... I have come that they may have <u>life</u>, and that they may have it <u>more abundantly</u>.



D. His Blood secures the <u>blessings</u> of the new covenant for us.

Hebrews 4:16 Let us therefore come <u>boldly</u> to the throne of grace, that we may obtain <u>mercy</u> and find <u>grace</u> to help in time of need.



E. We overcome the evil one by His Blood.

Revelation 12:11 And they <u>overcame him by the blood</u> <u>of the Lamb</u> and by the word of their testimony, and they did not love their lives to the death.



E. We overcome the evil one by His Blood.

Hebrews 2:14-15

14 Inasmuch then as the children have partaken of flesh and blood, <u>He Himself</u> likewise shared in the same, that through death He might <u>destroy him who had the power of death</u>, that is, the devil, 15 and <u>release those who through fear</u> of death were all their lifetime subject to bondage.



F. The Blood of Christ <u>reconciles</u> all things in heaven and earth.

Colossians 1:20 and by Him to <u>reconcile all things</u> to Himself, by Him, whether things <u>on earth</u> or things <u>in heaven</u>, having <u>made peace through the blood</u> <u>of His cross</u>.



Bottom Line: Jesus, our Passover Lamb

John 6:53-54, 56 53 Then Jesus said to them, "Most assuredly, I say to you, <u>unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink</u> <u>His blood, you have no life in you. 54 Whoever eats</u> <u>My flesh and drinks My blood has eternal life</u>, and I will raise him up at the last day. 56 He who eats My flesh and drinks My blood <u>abides in Me</u>, <u>and I in him</u>.
