In all the biblical examples and that of all men and women whose lives are yielded for His purpose :

God always has two primary agendas:-

- 1. The type of <u>PERSON</u>
- 2. The fulfillment of His <u>PURPOSE</u> through that person

The Christian with a Life of Purpose 2 fundamental issues :-**WHO** am I becoming? (1) (2)Am I fulfilling God's AND PURPOS for my life?

God is looking for a certain type of **PERSON** Who am I becoming? This relates to our Core-Being **Our Core-Being comprise : Our Character** Π. **Our Personal Baggage**

Our Core-Being determines our Conduct **Our Conduct comprise :-Our underlying <u>ATTITUDES</u> and** 1. Our actual **BEHAVIOUR** 2. in terms of the way we posture – body language, relate, act and respond to others **Our Conduct reflects** our inner values / convictions

Personal Conduct Issues

We must aim i.e. set goals to have :

- (a) A <u>CONSCIENCE</u> void of offense before God and towards men
- (b) Intentionally put <u>SAFEGUARDS</u> in the areas of vulnerability in our personal conduct *(attitude & behaviour)*

EG3 **Money** Issues Luke 16:11-12 Therefore if you have not been faithful in the unrighteous mammon, who will commit to your trust the true riches? And if you have not been faithful in what is another man's property, who will give you what is your own?

<u>E G 4</u> Personality Weakness Issues The D s : Doers; Dominant Personalities - watch your pushiness - work on gentleness and patience

<u>E G 4</u> Personality Weakness Issues The I s – Influencers, People Relaters - watch your impulsiveness - close the loop

<u>E G 4</u> Personality Weakness Issues The S s – Steady, Amiable people - build your convictions - make your stand

<u>E G 4</u> Personality Weakness Issues The C s – Compliant, Detailed - do not miss the big picture - you do not have to fight every battle

To live a life pleasing to God. To live a life void of offense before God and men our Conduct must overflow from our soul (Mind, Emotion and Will) that is continually dealt with by God

(1) <u>Mind</u>

Our Conduct should flow from a mind that is <u>daily renewed</u> <u>after the mind of Christ</u>.

(Romans 12:1 – 2; Phil 2:5; 1 Cor 2:16)

(2) Emotion

Our Conduct should flow from our emotion tempered / molded by the Holy Spirit to manifest the fruit of the Spirit

(Gal 5:22 – 23)

(3) <u>Will</u>

Our Conduct should flow from decisions in our will that are <u>aligned with the Father God</u>. We then have the knowledge, spiritual wisdom and spiritual understanding to make correct enlightened decisions and choices. (Colossians 1:9 – 10) John 1:14 ¹⁴And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we beheld His glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father, <u>full of grace and truth</u>.

2 Peter 3:18 ... grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ

Core Values are <u>CONVICTIONS</u> the Holy Spirit has laid on your heart. They become your <u>GUIDING PRINCIPLES</u> in life.




