


4 Characteristics in Paul's life:


(1) A man of Humility (2: 3-11)

(3) A man of abundant Joy (3:1,3;4:4)


(4) A man of Contentment (4:10-13)

2:5-8

"Have this mind among yourselves which is yours in Christ Jesus, who, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, but made Himself nothing, taking the form of a servant, being born the likeness of men. PASSION

3:7-10
