- 6 And you will hear of <u>wars and rumors of wars</u>. See that you are not troubled; for all these things must come to pass, but the end is not yet.
- 7 For <u>nation will rise against nation</u>, <u>and kingdom against kingdom</u>. And there will be <u>famines</u>, <u>pestilences</u>, and <u>earthquakes</u> in various places. All these are the beginning of sorrows.
- 12 And because **awlessness will abound**, the love of many will grow cold.








In the world you will have tribulation; but be of good cheer, I have overcome the world."








II. The <u>horror</u> of sin and the <u>penalty</u> paid by the death of the Lord Jesus.

Romans 1:29-32 - horror of sin

29 being filled with all unrighteousness, sexual immorality, wickedness, covetousness, maliciousness; full of envy, murder, strife, deceit, evil-mindedness; they are whisperers, 30 backbiters, haters of God, violent, proud, boasters, inventors of evil things, disobedient to parents, 31 undiscerning, untrustworthy, unloving, unforgiving, unmerciful; 32 who, knowing the righteous judgment of God, that those who practice such things are deserving of death, not only do the same but also approve of those who practice them.






Isaiah 53:3-7

3 He was <u>despised</u> and <u>rejected</u> by men, a <u>Man of sorrows</u> and <u>acquainted with grief</u> ... 4 Surely He has <u>borne our griefs and carried our sorrows</u>; yet we esteemed Him <u>stricken</u>, <u>smitten</u> by God, and <u>afflicted</u>. 5 But He was <u>wounded</u> for our transgressions, He was <u>bruised</u> for our iniquities; the <u>chastisement</u> for our peace was upon Him, and by His <u>stripes</u> we are healed. 6 ... the LORD has <u>laid on Him the iniquity</u> <u>of us all</u>. 7 He was <u>oppressed</u> and He was <u>afflicted</u>, yet He opened not His mouth; He was led as a <u>lamb</u> <u>to the slaughter</u>, and as a sheep before its shearers is silent, so He opened not His mouth.

2 utterances from the cross:
The first

Matthew 27:46 And about the ninth hour Jesus cried out with a loud voice, saying, "Eli, Eli, lama sabachthani?" that is, "My God, My God, why have You forsaken Me?"



2 utterances from the cross: The second

John 19:28 - "I Thirst"

After this, Jesus knowing that all things were now accomplished, that the Scripture might be fulfilled, said, "I thirst!"

Luke 16:24 Then he cried and said, Father Abraham, have mercy on me, and send Lazarus that he may dip the tip of his finger in water and cool my tongue; for I am tormented in this flame.







II. The <u>horror</u> of sin and the <u>penalty</u> paid by the death of the Lord Jesus.

1 John 4:9-10

9 In this the <u>love of God</u> was manifested toward us, that God has <u>sent His only begotten Son</u> into the world, that we might live through Him.
10 In this is love, not that we loved God, but that <u>He loved us and sent His Son to be the propitiation for our sins</u>.









- III. <u>Appropriate</u> the <u>Divine Exchange</u> provided for us at the Cross.
 - 2. No more <u>fears</u>.

Romans 8:15 For you did not receive the <u>spirit</u> of bondage again to fear, but you received the Spirit of adoption by whom we cry out, "Abba, Father."

2 Timothy 1:7










III. Appropriate the Divine Exchange provided for us at the Cross. 2. No more fears. 1 John 4:18 There is no fear in love; but perfect love casts out fear, because fear involves torment. But he who fears has not been made perfect in love. Is your life MOSTLY free from fears?



- III. <u>Appropriate</u> the <u>Divine Exchange</u> provided for us at the Cross.
 - 3. No more **<u>quilt</u>** and **<u>condemnation</u>**.

Romans 8:1-2

1 There is therefore now <u>no</u> <u>condemnation</u> to those who are in Christ Jesus, who do not walk according to the flesh, but according to the Spirit. 2 For the law of the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus has made me <u>free from the law of sin and death</u>.





John 8:9-11 [Woman caught in adultery]
9 Then those who heard it, being convicted by their conscience, went out one by one, beginning with the oldest even to the last. And Jesus was left alone, and the woman standing in the midst. 10 When Jesus had raised Himself up and saw no one but the woman, He said to her, "Woman, where are those accusers of yours? Has no one condemned you?" 11 She said, "No one, Lord." And Jesus said to her, "Neither do I condemn you; go and sin no more."

Pursue Guilt-Free, No-Condemnation relationship with God

 - 4. No more curses.

Examples of Curses:

When almost everything seems to go wrong most of the time

Marriage Failures across generations

Same sickness - disease like cancer crippling various members of the family

Negative behavior patterns

Inability to handle money

Repeated abuses

Freak accidents


- III. <u>Appropriate</u> the <u>Divine Exchange</u> provided for us at the Cross
 - 4. No more curses.

Galatians 3:13-14

13 Christ has <u>redeemed us</u> from the <u>curse of the law</u>, having become a curse for us (for it is written, "Cursed is everyone who hangs on a tree"), 14 that the <u>blessing</u> of Abraham might come upon the Gentiles in Christ Jesus, that we might <u>receive the promise of the Spirit through</u> faith.
