

Luke 21:10-11

10 Then He said to them, "Nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. **11** And there will be great earthquakes in various places, and famines and pestilences; and there will be fearful sights and great signs from heaven.



Luke 21:25-26, 28

25 And there will be signs in the sun, in the moon, and in the stars; and on the earth distress of nations, with perplexity, the sea and the waves roaring;26 men's hearts failing them from fear and the expectation of those things which are coming on the earth, for the powers of the heavens will be shaken.

28 Now when these things begin to happen, look up and lift up your heads, because your redemption draws near.

Scriptures regarding Turbulent End-Times

Luke 21:34-36

34 But take heed to yourselves, lest your hearts be weighed down with carousing, drunkenness, and cares of this life, and that Day come on you unexpectedly. **35** For it will come as a snare on all those who dwell on the face of the whole earth. **36** Watch therefore, and pray always that

you may be counted worthy to escape all these things that will come to pass, and to stand before the Son of Man.



Romans 1:21, 23

21 because, although they knew God, they did not glorify Him as God, nor were thankful, but became futile in their thoughts, and their foolish hearts were darkened.

23 and changed the glory of the incorruptible God into an image made like corruptible man—and birds and four-footed animals and creeping things.

Scriptures regarding Turbulent End-Times

Romans 1:26-27

26 For this reason God gave them up to vile passions. For even their women exchanged the natural use for what is against nature.
27 Likewise also the men, leaving the natural use of the woman, burned in their lust for one another, men with men committing what is shameful, and receiving in themselves the penalty of their error which was due.

Romans 1:29-32

29 being filled with all unrighteousness, sexual immorality, wickedness, covetousness, maliciousness; full of envy, murder, strife, deceit, evil-mindedness; they are whisperers, **30** backbiters, haters of God, violent, proud, boasters, inventors of evil things, disobedient to parents, **31** undiscerning, untrustworthy, unloving, unforgiving, unmerciful; **32** who, knowing the righteous judgment of God, that those who practice such things are deserving of death, not only do the same but also approve of those who practice them.

Scriptures regarding Turbulent End-Times

1 Timothy 4:1 Now the Spirit expressly says that in latter times some will depart from the faith, giving heed to deceiving spirits and doctrines of demons.



2 Timothy 3:1-5

1 But know this, that in the last days perilous times will come: **2** For men will be lovers of themselves, lovers of money, boasters, proud, blasphemers, disobedient to parents, unthankful, unholy, **3** unloving, unforgiving, slanderers, without self-control, brutal, despisers of good, **4** traitors,

headstrong, haughty, lovers of pleasure rather than lovers of God, **5** having a form of godliness but denying its power. And from such people turn away!

Genesis 6:5, 11-12

5 Then the Lord saw that the <u>wickedness</u> of man was great in the earth, and that every intent of the thoughts of his heart was only <u>evil</u> continually.
11 The earth also was <u>corrupt</u> before God, and the earth was filled with <u>violence</u>. 12 So God looked upon the earth, and indeed it was <u>corrupt</u>; for <u>all flesh had corrupted their way</u> <u>on the earth</u>.

Matthew 24:6-8, 12 - worst of times

6 And you will hear of <u>wars and rumors of wars</u>. See that you are not troubled; for all these things must come to pass, but the end is not yet.
7 For <u>nation will rise against nation</u>, <u>and kingdom against kingdom</u>. And there will be <u>famines</u>, <u>pestilences</u>, and <u>earthquakes</u> in various places. 8 All these are the beginning of sorrows.
12 And because <u>lawlessness will abound</u>, the love of many will grow cold.


Isaiah 33:6 Wisdom and knowledge will be the stability of your times, and the strength of salvation; the fear of the Lord is His treasure.

II. Understand what is God's Will.





Psalm 119:160 <u>The entirety of Your word is truth</u>, and every one of Your righteous judgments endures forever.

- A. The language of the OT (Hebrews) attributes everything to <u>God</u>.
- **B.** But it is **NOT** God who did that specific act.
- C. Understand the underlying principle.

IV. Interpreting Scriptures and Hebraic Writings - e.g. 1

1 Samuel 2:25 If one man sins against another, God will judge him. But if a man sins against the Lord, who will intercede for him?" Nevertheless they did not heed the voice of their father, <u>because</u> <u>the Lord desired to kill them</u>.

1 Samuel 2:17 Therefore the <u>sin of the young men was very great</u> before the Lord, for men abhorred the offering of the Lord.

1 Samuel 2:22 Now Eli was very old; and he heard everything his sons did to all Israel, and how they lay with the women who assembled at the door of the tabernacle of meeting.



Ephesians 4:26-27


26 "Be <u>angry</u>, and do not sin": do not let the sun go down on <u>your wrath</u>,
27 <u>nor give place to the devil</u>.



 Fracture of the physical <u>earth</u> and corruption of the <u>environment</u>.

Romans 8:22 For we know that the <u>whole creation</u> groans and <u>labors</u> with <u>birth pangs</u> together until now.

Droughts and Floods Tsunamis Typhoons

Earthquakes Tornadoes Volcanic Eruptions

Extreme Weather resulting in Hurricanes

A. The Fallen-ness of Man results in:

4. The curse of toil in man's labour.

Genesis 3:17-19

17 Then to Adam He said, "Because you have heeded the voice of your wife, and have eaten from the tree of which I commanded you, saying, 'You shall not eat of it': "<u>Cursed is the ground</u> for your sake; in <u>toil</u> you shall eat of it all the days of your life. 18 Both <u>thorns and thistles</u> it shall bring forth for you, and you shall eat the herb of the field. 19 In the <u>sweat</u> of your face you shall eat bread till you return to the ground, for out of it you were taken; for dust you are, and to dust you shall return."

A. The Fallen-ness of Man results in:

- 5. <u>Accidents</u> due to man's carelessness, blind spots, malfunction of machines, etc.
 - Wrong Time Wrong Place

A. The Fallen-ness of Man.

- "Good" things may happen to "bad" people;
- "Bad" things may happen to "good" people;
- "Good" people may suffer whilst "bad" people may not suffer.


Ecclesiastes 8:14 There is a vanity which occurs on earth, that there are just men to whom it happens according to the work of the wicked; again, there are wicked men to whom it happens according to the work of the righteous. I said that this also is vanity.

A. The Fallen-ness of Man.

Therefore when someone dies from a <u>sickness</u> or an <u>earthquake</u>, it is due to the fallen-ness of man in a fallen world.

God is **NOT** the direct source of sickness or all the evil, accidents, wickedness and calamities on the earth.

V. Understanding direct sources of pain and sufferings.



B. The Evil One

John 10:10 The thief does not come except to <u>steal</u>, and to <u>kill</u>, and to <u>destroy</u>. I have come that they may have life, and that they may have it more abundantly.

John 8:44 You are of your father the <u>devil</u>, and the desires of your father you want to do. He was a <u>murderer</u> from the beginning, and does <u>not stand in the truth</u>, because there is <u>no truth in him</u>. When he speaks a <u>lie</u>, he speaks from his own resources, for he is <u>a liar and the father of it</u>.


B. The Evil One


1 Peter 5:8 Be sober, be vigilant; because your <u>adversary the devil</u> walks about like a roaring lion, <u>seeking whom he may</u> <u>devour</u>.

C. Due to our own "<u>faults</u>".





D. For righteousness sake. Persecution for our faith.



1 Peter 3:14 But even if you should <u>suffer</u> for righteousness' sake, you are blessed. "And do not be afraid of their threats, nor be troubled."

1 Peter 4:19 Therefore let those who <u>suffer</u> according to the will of God commit their souls to Him in <u>doing good</u>, as to a faithful Creator.

D. For <u>righteousness</u> sake. <u>Persecution</u> for our faith.



1 Peter 4:13-14, 16

13 but rejoice to the extent that you <u>partake of</u> <u>Christ's sufferings</u>, 14 If you are <u>reproached</u> <u>for the name of Christ</u>, blessed are you, for the Spirit of glory and of God rests upon you. On their part He is blasphemed, but on your part He is glorified. 16 Yet if anyone <u>suffers as</u> <u>a Christian</u>, let him not be ashamed, but let him glorify God in this matter.

D. For <u>righteousness</u> sake. <u>Persecution</u> for our faith.

Examples of persecution personally:

Being mocked / jeered at when something goes wrong. "So where is your God now? Why doesn't He help you?"

Being passed over for a promotion because you refuse to compromise on your integrity.

Being ostracized from your family and community because of your faith. Family upset with you for your refusal to partake in idol worship, ancestor worship etc

D. For <u>righteousness</u> sake. <u>Persecution</u> for our faith.

2 Timothy 3:12 Yes, and all who desire to live godly in Christ Jesus will suffer **persecution**.


Galatians 5:11 And I, brethren, if I still preach circumcision, why do I still suffer <u>persecution</u>? Then the <u>offense of</u> <u>the cross</u> has ceased.

D. For **<u>righteousness</u>** sake. <u>**Persecution**</u> for our faith.

Philippians 1:29 For it has been granted to you on behalf of Christ not only to believe on him, but also to <u>suffer for him</u>.



The <u>ultimate</u> suffering for righteousness sake is <u>martyrdom</u>, but this is <u>not</u> for <u>all</u> believers.



VI. Know that God is always good.

A. When <u>bad things</u> happen to us, we must know that God did <u>**not**</u> cause it

i.e. He is **<u>not</u>** the source or origin of the bad thing happening.

VI. Know that God[®]is <u>always</u> good.

B. God is the giver of everything <u>good</u>.

Luke 11:13 If you then, being evil, know how to give <u>good gifts</u> to your children, <u>how much more</u> will your heavenly Father give the <u>Holy Spirit</u> to those who ask Him!"

James 1:17 Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above, and comes down from the Father of lights, with whom there is no variation or shadow of turning.

VI. Know that God is always good.

C. We must live our lives in <u>total</u> dependence on God i.e. on His <u>promises</u> and <u>covenant</u>.

Luke 13:1-5


There were present at that season some who told Him about the Galileans whose blood Pilate had mingled with their sacrifices. 2 And Jesus answered and said to them, "Do you suppose that these Galileans were worse sinners than all other Galileans, because they suffered such things?
 I tell you, no; but unless you repent you will all likewise perish.

VI. Know that God is always good.

C. We must live our lives in <u>total</u> dependence on God i.e. on His <u>promises</u> and <u>covenant</u>.

Luke 13:1-5

4 Or those eighteen on whom the <u>tower in Siloam fell and killed them</u>, do you think that they were worse sinners than all other men who dwelt in Jerusalem? 5 I tell you, no; but <u>unless you repent you will all likewise</u> <u>perish</u>."



VI. Know that God is always good.

E. God is good and is **consistently** good all the time.

Exodus 34:6-7a

6 And <u>the LORD passed</u> before him and <u>proclaimed</u>, "The LORD, the LORD God, <u>merciful</u> and <u>gracious</u>, <u>longsuffering</u>, [slow to anger] and <u>abounding in goodness</u> and <u>truth</u>, 7 <u>keeping mercy</u> for thousands, <u>forgiving</u> iniquity and transgression and sin ...

BOTTOM-LINE - the LORD is GOOD! Otherwise:

- doom to a life of despair
- tragedy becomes senseless
- adversity becomes endless frustration
- faith turns to doubt, anger and bitterness

1 John 1:5b God is <u>light</u> and in Him is <u>no darkness</u> at all.
