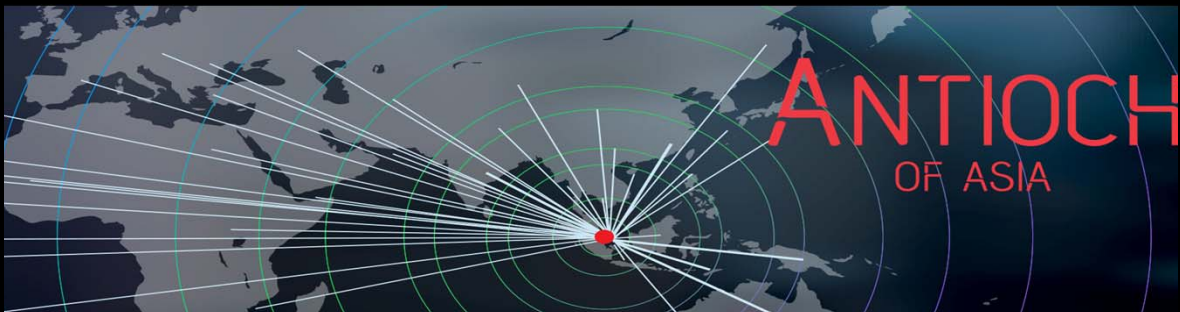

The Mission of the Church

Everyone on earth has a right to:

1. Hear and understand the gospel of Jesus Christ
2. Have a Bible available in his/her own language
- even nomads and homeless
3. All believers (the “**Church**”) have access to a fellowship group for worship, evangelize, discipleship and accountability (Matthew 28:18-2)

The Mission of the Church

Everyone on earth has a right to:

4. Christian Education (founded in a biblical Christian worldview) needs to be available for the young - not only preschool through university, but distance learning, home schooling, church education programmes, etc. (Matthew 28:18-20)

The Mission of the Church

Everyone on earth has a right to:

5. Everyone has the right to receive ministries of mercy: food, drink, shelter, clothing, healthcare (Matthew 25:35-36)
6. Lead a productive life of fulfillment spiritually, mentally, socially, emotionally and physically

Everyone on earth has a right to:

1. Hear and understand the gospel of Jesus Christ
2. Have a Bible available in his/her own language
3. Have a Christian fellowship available nearby, to be able to meet for fellowship regularly each week, and to have biblical teaching and worship with others in the body of Christ
4. Have a Christian education available for children
5. Have the basic necessities of life: food, water, clothing, shelter and healthcare
6. Lead a productive life of fulfillment spiritually, mentally, socially, emotionally and physically
