




A. God loves to be merciful to us. B. God wants to show His mercy through us





The Call of Matthew

Matthew 9:9-11 (ESV)


⁹ As Jesus passed on from there, he saw a man called <u>Matthew</u> sitting at the tax booth, and he said to him,
"<u>Follow me</u>." And he rose and followed him.
¹⁰ And as Jesus reclined at table in the house, behold, many <u>tax collectors</u> and <u>sinners</u> came and were reclining with Jesus and his disciples.

Matthew 9:11-13 (ESV)

¹¹ And when the <u>Pharisees</u> saw this, they said to his disciples, "Why does your teacher eat with <u>tax collectors</u> and <u>sinners</u>?"

¹² But when he heard it, he said, "Those who are well have no need of a physician, but those who are sick.

¹³ Go and learn what this means, 'I desire <u>mercy</u>, and not <u>sacrifice</u>.' For I came not to call the righteous, but sinners."



How does our heart become merciful?


... mercy comes from a heart that has first felt its spiritual bankruptcy, and has come to grieve over its sin, and has learned to wait meekly for the timing of the Lord, and to cry out in hunger for the work of his mercy to satisfy us with the righteousness we need.

Lesson 1: The opposite of mercy is sacrifice (Hosea 6:6)


Lesson 2: The opposite of mercy is Religious Trivia (v11)
