Jeremiah 28:2-3

2 This is what the Lord Almighty, the God of Israel, says: 'I will break the yoke of the king of Babylon. **3** Within two years I will bring back to this place all the articles of the Lord's house that Nebuchadnezzar king of Babylon removed from here and took to Babylon.





4 Thus says the Lord of hosts, the God of Israel, to all the exiles whom I have sent into exile from Jerusalem to Babylon, **5** 'Build houses and live in them; and plant gardens and eat their produce. **6** Take wives and become the fathers of sons and daughters, and take wives for your sons and give your daughters to husbands, that they may bear sons and daughters; and multiply there and do not decrease.

7 Seek the welfare of the city where I have sent you into exile, and pray to the Lord on its behalf; for in its welfare you will have welfare.
8 For thus says the Lord of hosts, the God of Israel, 'Do not let your prophets who are in your midst and your diviners deceive you, and do not listen to the dreams which they dream. 9 For they prophesy falsely to you in My name; I have not sent them,' declares the Lord.

10 "For thus says the Lord, 'When seventy years have been completed for Babylon, I will visit you and fulfill My good word to you, to bring you back to this place. **11** For I know the plans that I have for you,' declares the Lord, 'plans for welfare and not for calamity to give you a future and a hope. **12** Then you will call upon Me and come and pray to Me, and I will listen to you.

SOBERING STATISTICS

- **4563** youths aged 10 to 19 called the SOS suicide hotline (2015-16).
- 3 in 4 say they have been cyber bullied, some from as young as 8 years old of age. Almost 2 in 3 of those bullied become bullies themselves.
- 10–14% of Singaporeans still face severe financial problems and have difficulties meeting basic needs.

SOBERING STATISTICS

- Singapore has around **500,000** people aged 65 and older, and the number is expected to almost double to about **900,000** by 2030.

- By 2030, there will be an estimated **83,000** seniors living alone.
- The number of elderly aged 60 and above who took their own lives peaked at **129** last year, the highest since suicide tracking started in 1991.

No-win choices for the poor when resources are limited

The families I work with often buy standard tickets for one-way trips on public transport instead of using an ez-link card. This means they have to pay 10 cents more for each trip. But they do so because the minimum top-up value for an ez-link card is \$5 for children and \$10 for adults, and they need the cash for daily expenses.
