1 Peter 4:1-19

¹Therefore, since Christ suffered for us in the flesh, arm yourselves also with the same mind, for he who has suffered in the flesh has ceased from sin, ² that he no longer should live the rest of his time in the flesh for the lusts of men, but for the will of God. ³ For we have spent enough of our past lifetime in doing the will of the Gentiles - when we walked in lewdness, lusts, drunkenness, revelries, drinking parties, and abominable idolatries.

⁴ In regard to these, they think it strange that you do not run with them in the same flood of dissipation, speaking evil of you. ⁵ They will give an account to Him who is ready to judge the living and the dead. ⁶ For this reason the gospel was preached also to those who are dead, that they might be judged according to men in the flesh, but live according to God in the spirit. ⁷ But the end of all things is at hand; therefore be serious and watchful in your prayers.

⁸ And above all things have fervent love for one another, for "love will cover a multitude of sins." ⁹ Be hospitable to one another without grumbling. ¹⁰ As each one has received a gift, minister it to one another, as good stewards of the manifold grace of God. ¹¹ If anyone speaks, let him speak as the oracles of God. If anyone ministers, let him do it as with the ability which God supplies, that in all things God may be glorified through Jesus Christ,

to whom belong the glory and the dominion forever and ever. Amen. 12 Beloved, do not think it strange concerning the fiery trial which is to try you, as though some strange thing happened to you; 13 but rejoice to the extent that you partake of Christ's sufferings, that when His glory is revealed, you may also be glad with exceeding joy. ¹⁴ If you are reproached for the name of Christ, blessed are you, for the Spirit of glory and of God rests upon you. On their part He is blasphemed, but on your part He is glorified. 15 But let none of you suffer as a murderer, a thief, an evildoer, or as a busybody in other people's matters. ¹⁶ Yet if anyone suffers as a Christian, let him not be ashamed, but let him glorify God in this matter. 17 For the time has come for judgment to begin at the house of God; and if it begins with us first, what will be the end of those who do not obey the gospel of God?

¹⁸ Now "If the righteous one is scarcely saved, Where will the ungodly and the sinner appear?" ¹⁹ Therefore let those who suffer according to the will of God commit their souls to Him in doing good, as to a faithful Creator.

- being discriminated against for being Chinese
- increasing hostility against Jews, Chinese and Africans in Russia
- In East Timor the Protestant Christian minority is discriminated against by the Catholics majority.

- cell group at Morai
- 40-50 adults and children
- Padre stepped in and threatened the cell
- cell was decimated

1 Peter 4:14 (NKJV)

"If you are reproached for the name of Christ, blessed are you, for the Spirit of glory and of God rests upon you."

- Reproached:
 - ♦ to be insulted or reviled
 - be censured and suffer abuse
 - ♦ ridiculed
 - mocked and railed
- usually accompanied by discrimination of some kind
- excluded in an exclusive society

- Q: Do you suffer from discrimination because of your faith?
- Q: Do you suffer exclusion because you do not agree with your classmates about the LGBT issues?
 - Some of us suffer from years of exclusion by relatives in the war of clans.

1) Vicious victimization (Chapter 4:4, 12, 14). Word of Jesus:

Blessed are you when men hate you, and when they exclude you, and revile you, and cast out your name as evil, for the Son of Man's sake.

Luke 6:22 (NKJV)

- apostles shamed in public for the name of Christ and they went away rejoicing
 - * Acts 5:40-41 (NKJV) And they agreed with him, and when they had called for the apostles and beaten them, they commanded that they should not speak in the name of Jesus, and let them go.

41 So they departed from the presence of the council, rejoicing that they were counted worthy to suffer shame for His name.

- World wants us to think like them

Worldly mind-set

- world thinks enjoyment
- How they think leads to how they act
- "doing the will of the Gentiles"
- they would run in flood of dissipation

1 Peter 4:3-4 (NKJV)

- 2) Mentality of a transformed person (Chapter 4 : 1-3)
- Flood of dissipation means dissolute excess

1 Peter 4: 3-5 (AMP)

For the time already past is [more than] enough for doing what the [unsaved] Gentiles like to do - living [unrestrained as you have done] in a course of [shameless] sensuality, lusts, drunkenness, carousing, drinking parties, and wanton idolatries.

⁴ In [connection with] all this, they [the unbelievers] are resentful and surprised that you do not [think like them, value their values and] run [hand in hand] with them into the same excesses of dissipation and immoral freedom, and they criticize and abuse and ridicule you and make fun of your values.

1 Peter 4:3-5 (AMP)

- 2) Mentality of a transformed person (Chapter 4 : 1-3)
- In regard to these, they think it strange that you do not run with them in the same flood of dissipation, speaking evil of you. 1 Peter 4:4 (NKJV)

- world treasures freedom especially immoral freedom and they have cornered the whole definition of freedom:
 - freedom to engage shameless sensuality, lusts, drunkenness and drinking parties
 - inalienable human right

- 2) Mentality of a transformed person (Chapter 4 : 1-3)
- Leviticus 18:22 (NLT) "Do not practice homosexuality, having sex with another man as with a woman. It is a detestable sin."

Leviticus 20:13 (NLT) "If a man practices homosexuality, having sex with another man as with a woman, both men have committed a detestable act. They must both be put to death, for they are guilty of a capital offense."

Romans 1: 26-27 (NLT)

That is why God abandoned them to their shameful desires. Even the women turned against the natural way to have sex and instead indulged in sex with each other. ²⁷ And the men, instead of having normal sexual relations with women, burned with lust for each other.

Men did shameful things with other men, and as a result of this sin, they suffered within themselves the penalty they deserved. Romans 1: 26-27 (NLT)

1 Corinthians 6:9 (NKJV) Do you not know that the unrighteous will not inherit the kingdom of God? Do not be deceived. Neither fornicators, nor idolaters, nor adulterers, nor homosexuals, nor sodomites.

- Christian mind-set: freedom in Christ
- surprised that you do not [think like them, value their values and] run [hand in hand] with them into the same excesses of dissipation and immoral freedom . . . 1 Pet 4:4 (AMP)

- By divine exchange Jesus gives us true freedom.

Romans 6: 20-22 (NKJV)

For when you were slaves of sin, you were free in regard to righteousness. 21 What fruit did you have then in the things of which you are now ashamed? For the end of those things is death. ²² But now having been set free from sin, and having become - slaves of God, you have your fruit to holiness, and the end, everlasting life.

1 Corinthians 7:22 (NKJV)

For he who is called in the Lord while a slave is the Lord's freedman. Likewise he who is called while free is Christ's slave.

- Christian mind-set on suffering
- Christians also have the mind set to suffer for Christ and would think nothing of suffering.
- Christians do enjoy life when the Lord grants them things to enjoy.

- But the default mode should be suffering.

Philippians 2:5-11 (NKJV)

Let this mind be in you which was also in Christ Jesus, ⁶ who, being in the form of God, did not consider it robbery to be equal with God, ⁷ but made Himself of no reputation, taking the form of a bondservant, and coming in the likeness of men.

⁸ And being found in appearance as a man, He humbled Himself and became obedient to the point of death, even the death of the cross. ⁹ Therefore God also has highly exalted Him and given Him the name which is above every name,

10 that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of those in heaven, and of those on earth, and of those under the earth, 11 and that every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

Philippians 3: 12-16 (NKJV)

Not that I have already attained, or am already perfected; but I press on, that I may lay hold of that for which Christ Jesus has also laid hold of me. 13 Brethren, I do not count myself to have apprehended; but one thing I do, forgetting those things which are behind and reaching forward

to those things which are ahead, 14 I press toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus. 15 Therefore let us, as many as are mature, have this mind; and if in anything you think otherwise, God will reveal even this to you.

¹⁶ Nevertheless, to the degree that we have already attained, let us walk by the same rule, let us be of the same mind.

- implication of suffering
- We are to present our bodies as a living sacrifice.
- matter of choice

1 Peter 4:14 (AMPC) If you are censured and suffer abuse [because you bear] the name of Christ, blessed [are you - happy, fortunate, to be envied, with life-joy, and satisfaction in God's favour and salvation, regardless of your outward condition], because the

Spirit of glory, the Spirit of God, is resting upon you. On their part He is blasphemed, but on your part He is glorified.
