A. INTRODUCTION TO PRAYING FOR OUR FRIENDS

Why Pray?

'Why Pray?' is the first of the three parts (Pray, Engage, Gather) of the entire initiative.

Because Prayer moves the Hand that moves the world.

Because Prayer is the track that the Grace of God runs on.

There are many good reasons to remind us of the importance of prayer in the Kingdom of God. Indeed, it is a kingdom lifestyle.

Specifically, to the whole Celebration of Hope, prayer is our first recourse with God. We recognise the importance of relying on God to see His kingdom come and His will be done. Salvation only comes with the convicting work of God through the Holy Spirit (John 16:8).

As such, we seek to impart to all the participants the skills and knowledge needed to effectively engage God in prayer. And in this regard, the need to pray with scripture, concerning our pre-believing friends. This is claiming God's promise over their lives.

Many of us have loved ones, relatives or friends who are not ready to come to faith because they hold on to certain beliefs or misconceptions of the faith.

Some might have negative experiences with Christians and hence the offences have stood as barriers to faith. Others might have promised to observe rituals for their departed loved ones and hence they don't see how they could receive Jesus as their Savior.



This segment contains sample prayers regarding the barriers to faith. They are by no means comprehensive. You may vary the prayers to suit the situation as it relates to the persons you are praying for.

Submit therefore to God. Resist the devil and he will flee from you. -James 4:7

We look forward to the day when our loved ones will cross over the barriers to profess faith in Christ. Until then, let's press on with praying and sowing till breakthroughs happen – for His glory!

Dear Father in heaven,

My _____ thinks that all religions are the same and this is keeping him from turning to Jesus who has been revealed as the way, truth and life.^a Hence, I pray for his understanding to be enlightened. Let his thoughts be taken captive to the obedience of Jesus Christ. Let him come to know that apart from Jesus, there is no other way of salvation under heaven.^b

Father God, even for such held captive to blindness, deception and ignorance, surely Your light can dispel the darkness and shatter the veil.^c Surely Your truth can demolish every argument, dismantle every pretence and expose every lie. Even as Jesus came to destroy the works of the devil, let every shade of blindness be overcome by light; every scheme of deception be exposed for its subtlety and every measure of ignorance overwhelmed by Your wisdom.

Certainly as Your arm to save is greater than the arm that steals, kills

and destroys, even so, have the evil ones confounded in their schemes and uprooted in their evil devices.

Have my loved ones know the truth that Jesus is the only way to You. Let them be quickened to understand that if all religions lead to You, then Jesus wouldn't need to show the way and neither would He need to be incarnated as a Man. Let them come to see that Jesus' terrible sufferings and death at the Cross would have been unnecessary if man could be saved by other means.

Father God, glorify Your Son. Even as He will draw all men unto You when He is lifted up, so let them be drawn to Jesus.^d As Jesus came to set the captives free, let it be to Your glory that my loved ones are indeed set free! It is to Your glory that the evil ones be utterly confounded such that even at the eleventh hour,

Your strong arm is able to deliver such from their clutches. This is so as You have disarmed principalities and powers and have made a public spectacle of them, triumphing over them in it.^e

O Father God, let his salvation be the angels' rejoicing and Your glory.

So in the name of Jesus, let the victory of Jesus be the devil's flight and nightmare. I remind the evil ones that they have been thoroughly defeated and that the church prevails against them. Therefore, all their attempts to blind and to deceive my loved ones shall be rendered ineffectual, shattered and inoperative. I enforce the written judgment that has already been meted out against them.^f

I attest to God's power that His power to save is greater than the power to steal, kill and destroy. James 4:7 says that as I resist the devil, he shall flee. So by the Blood of the Lamb and in the name of Jesus, I resist the evil ones. Even as they may come in one way, they shall now be scattered seven other ways.

As principalities and powers have been disarmed by Jesus' victory, and as Jesus has come to set the captives free, so I pull down all deception, lies and falsehood rallied against my loved ones.⁹

Thank You God that the way for salvation of my loved ones has been made. Be magnified, O God, and be praised!

Dear Father in heaven,

My loved ones think money is what makes the world go round. To them, money is 'god' and hence idolatry has set in.^a

As this runs against Your will, I pray for their minds to be enlightened.

Awaken them to see the transient nature of money. Where they have given themselves to greed, let them see the evils that can arise out of covetousness and how greed can corrupt a person. Your word tells us that money is a root of evil.^b

As the Lord has come to set the captives free, even so let every one of them be mightily released from the clutches of covetousness.

As light has shone, they shall not remain blinded and deluded by greed but rather be enlightened by Your light and truth, and be delivered by Your grace and mercy. Indeed the veil that is blinding them shall not remain there perpetually and just the same they shall not remain bound in idolatry.

Let them know that money can neither buy love, peace, eternity and nor the forgiveness of sins. Indeed let them see the vanity of riches that life does not consist in the abundance of riches.^c Moreover, awaken them to the incapability of money to deal with the moral issue of sin.

Let them be awakened to know that You alone are God, immeasurably greater than money. Let them know that when they seek You and Your righteousness, their needs will be provided.^d

As it benefits them to be delivered sooner than later, I pray for a powerful break-in of your truth that will set them free.

It's time they are awakened from vanity and idolatry to serve You. It's time these hands that are used for the

furtherance of idolatry be used for the extension of Your kingdom. It's time these vessels that are lost become Your instruments of righteousness.

Therefore, Father God, let Your Hands that are not short to save, deliver the divine transactions they need and turn them from darkness to light, from slaves of greed to servants of righteousness.^e

So in the name of Jesus, I bring upon the heads of the evil ones the sentence that has been executed upon them. Through the victory at the Cross, I proclaim what has been declared – that as the church prevails against the gates of hades, even so as part of the Church, I shall prevail against the enemies. Their works have lost their power and their clutches have lost their grip. Light has come and darkness is retreating.

My loved ones shall remain no longer as captives to the schemes of the devil. Rather as light has broken through into the world and into my life, it shall also break through into the lives of those in my family.

Money shall no longer be their god. Idolatry shall no longer steal them from the true worship of God. Rather, they shall come into the revelation of Jesus as the God to whom worship is due.

Dear Father in heaven,

My loved ones were offended by Christians and hence they don't think they would ever believe in Jesus.

First, I identify with the failures of Christians to be good testimonies. Please forgive me. Please enlighten me to areas in which they took offence with, either with me or with others so that the issues can be addressed and better responded to.

Whatever the cause of offence might be, let them come to the place where they could see things with a broader perspective. Where they have stereotyped Christians by the bad experiences they had with Christians, let them come to see that the behaviour is not representative of other Christians.

Let them come into the path of such Christians whose testimonies would positively change their mind and wonderfully alter their perceptions for good.^{a,b} Where they have been given to wrong perceptions of the faith, I pray for enlightenment and a surprising change of mind-set towards Christians.

Instead of taking offences with Christians, let their eyes be directed to Jesus who is without sin.

Let the conviction of the Spirit fall strongly upon them so that they will be awakened to their own offences against You and see the need to personally repent. Yes, let such not be overtaken by the faults of others but be awakened to see their own failures.^c

Let them realise that their personal standing is not any more righteous than Christians who failed but that they are in utter need of your mercy and forgiveness as well.^d Let the scales fall from their eyes and let them experience a wonderful change of stance towards the faith. With man, it may seem impossible for change to happen but thank You that with You, the unexpected can happen.^e

Let it happen for Your glory.

So in the name of Jesus, even as I have been made more than conquerors through Christ, I now come against the works of the evil ones. The devil's works of deception against my loved ones shall be exposed and torn down. They shall be cut down in their strength, scattered in their union and derailed in their plans.

Every high thought against the knowledge of Christ shall be confounded, every measure of pride abashed, every stronghold pulled down and every argument taken captive to the obedience and knowledge of Jesus Christ.

The Cross shall no longer be an offence to such whose salvation I am praying for. Rather, the gospel shall be the power of God for their salvation.

Dear Heavenly Father,

My loved ones think they don't need You. They think they know better. Please forgive their presumptuousness, pride, indifference and arrogance for in their unenlightened state of blindness, they know not what they are doing.^a

I pray for revelations to be released upon them. Let them come to the place of need for You. Reveal Yourself to them through dreams and circumstances of their lives.

Let every high thought that is opposed to the knowledge of Jesus Christ be brought low and be powerfully abashed. Let Your wisdom triumph over every human wisdom, philosophy and argument.^b Let the gospel not be veiled any longer.

Even as Christ has come to destroy the works of the devil,^c so let the wisdom of Christ and the light of the glory of Christ pierce powerfully through the blindness and dismantle every pretence, conceit, argument, tradition and vain philosophy that stand in the way. Let them come to the knowledge of the truth and be wondrously set free by the truth.^d

I pray that their sense of self-sufficiency will be overtaken by the need for You; the sense of pride overtaken by a humble acknowledgement of Your existence, and the veil of blindness to be powerfully shattered by the entrance of Your light. Let them come to see the need for repentance.^e

Let divine transactions happen that will have them translated from the kingdom of darkness to the Kingdom of Your dear Son Jesus Christ.

So, in the name of Jesus, I resist the devil's deceitful ways against my loved ones. I resist their operations in my family tree. My loved ones shall not come into the path of the destroyer and neither be taken captive as their spoils.

Rather, Jesus has come to set the captives free and hence, it's time now for the devil to flee and to do so losing his captives.

I ride on the victory of the Cross, I come under the Blood of the Lamb, in the name of Jesus, I attest to what Jesus has accomplished, that He has triumphed over principalities and powers and has made a public spectacle of them.^f

I pray now that even as it is not the Father's will for any to perish, even so that none of my loved ones shall remain in spiritual blindness but come into repentance.

Thank You Father God for to You belong the glory, power and dominion.

Dear Heavenly Father,

My ______ feels it is not right for him to forsake ______ who has passed away without Christ.

He thinks that he would still be able to meet up again with ______ in the same place in the afterlife. Let him be enlightened that hell is a place where what he perceives to be is not what it actually is. Awaken him to the knowledge that one may not see his loved ones in the same place and much less stay together in hell.^a

Let him be awakened to the horror of hell that it is not live-able the way it's thought but a terrible place of torment and suffering.^b More than that, let him come to see that even though he wants to be there in hell with the departed loved one, the departed loved one's desire is not for him to be there.^c Hence this would contradict the desire of the departed loved one and would only add greater grief to the person if he would end up there. I pray also for enlightenment to the issue and to the penalty of sin. Let him come to see it's not about being faithful to the departed ones but about the need to deal with the issue of sin, an issue which every individual including him has to deal with.^d Hence, let him not be blinded anymore.

As Jesus has come to set the captives free and to give sight to the blind, even so, let spiritual sight be given him. Let him be gripped with the reality of the lake of fire and of a lost eternity without Christ, if one's name is not found in the Book of Life.^e

Thank You that Jesus is the light of the world. I look forward to the day when my loved one comes into the light.

So now in the name of Jesus, I put on the armor of God and stand against the wiles of the devil. Every demonic scheme that has been conceived against my loved ones and

which is founded upon falsehood and deception shall not stand but be utterly shattered. Every demonic and devious lie shall be exposed as His truth and light shines upon my loved ones. The Cross shall triumph over the works of the devil again and again.

Let their mind-set be positively changed and cause them to know that You alone are God and there is no other. It shall not be that they shall remain in ignorance and deception.

Even as Jesus has been manifested, let them come to the Light. As the knowledge of the glory of the Lord shall cover the earth as the waters cover the sea,^a so it shall be that these would not be denied the knowledge of the Lord but come into acknowledgement of their need for the one true God and Saviour. as they see Jesus being believed in by people of all tribes and tongues and especially those of their own tongue and culture.^b Indeed, whatever the barriers to faith might be, let them be dismantled by Your power. Let them be persuaded and be drawn to You by Your great love for them. Let every pretense, pride and veneer be overcome as they come to sight, knowledge and understanding of the Cross.

Yes, Father God, let them know so clearly that besides Jesus, there is no other way of salvation.^c So, let them come into the time of Your visitation and positively make the right response. Let it be as the Scripture said that today is the day of salvation^d and hence it shall not be that their hearts remain hardened. Rather, let heaven rejoice to see them amongst the tribes, tongues and languages, standing before Your glorious throne and praising You for Your mercy, grace and goodness.

Dear Heavenly Father,

My loved ones think that good works are good enough to save them. They feel that so long as a person doesn't commit hideous crimes, one is good enough to be saved.

O Father God, open their eyes to see that any form of man's righteousness is still like dirty rags^a and that all stand guilty before You. I pray that they will come to see why good works and observation of the law^b can not save and that they need to enter into a saving relationship with You.

O Father God, forbid it that they should remain in blindness and deception. Let this lie of the devil be utterly torn down. Let this persuasion be exposed for its inefficacy to save.^c Let this thinking be no longer embraced by them as the clutch for their salvation. As everyone falls short of Your glory, let the truth sink deeply and let my loved ones be arrested by a divine conviction so strong that they cannot but make a positive response toward Jesus.

Let the Cross be to them the statement of man's utter hopelessness to save themselves. Let them indeed see that the Cross has declared man's way of salvation to be null and void. Hence it's time for them to be awakened, that they need to place their faith in Jesus.^d

As it is not Your will for any to perish therefore let Your power that is able to divide light from darkness turn them from blindness to sight and from darkness to light.

Let Your Hands that can do the impossible bring about the change of perspective and turn them from faith in good works to faith in Jesus. Let Jesus be magnified as the way, truth and life.^e

And now in Jesus' name, I bind all deception and pride in human effort and cast them out of the lives of my loved ones.

STRATEGIC PRAYER

Dear Heavenly Father,

We have inherited from our ancestors many ways that are futile. Though many practices and belief systems of my family are far from Your ways, they have been accepted as part of our belief systems. Besides, the need to observe some of these traditions and practices have kept some of my family members from coming to faith.

One concern of my family members is the need to pray and offer food to loved ones who have passed on. Some of them are open to the gospel but have given their sense of piety and concern for the state of their departed loved ones, they are not ready to receive Jesus.

Father God, Your word tells us we are not redeemed with corruptible things received by traditions from our fathers.^a Let Your light shine so that they can know the truth and be set free. Let breakthrough happen so that they come to see that things are not what they perceive them to be that the reality of things in the spiritual realm is far from the beliefs and ways passed down.

Let them come to see that there is a chasm^b between the living and the dead and that whatever good they intend to do for them, it is not happening the way it is intended. Hence, let them see that it is not about them not being filial but rather about the futility of the works.

Father God, we are at a loss as to how this obstacle to faith could be crossed over but for You, nothing is impossible. Their eyes can be enlightened in ways beyond us to know. It had happened for Saul, someone whom no one would have imagined to have come to faith. Hence, as Your ways are higher than ours, You are able to reach them beyond those obstacles.

Therefore as we sow in prayer, we do so with hope, knowing that someday we shall reap.^c

STRATEGIC PRAYER

Dear Heavenly Father,

Some of those I know are not ready to receive Christ because of the promise they made to their relatives prior to their departure. They feel it would not be right of them to break their promise and fall short of their obligations.

Let them come to realise that while the promise was made out of piety, it was made without full understanding of what transpires after death.

Let them see that it's not about reneging on a promise but that the inoperative nature of it would render it null, void and futile. Hence the issue is not about being unfilial.

Ecclesiastes 9:6^a tells us that the dead have no more share in all that is done under the sun. Let them see that their earthly piety cannot benefit those who have passed on. Let them not be bound by the traditions of men^b but rather have them come to the truth and be set free. Let them be released from this obligation and find liberty in Christ.

Father God, do not leave them in their state of natural human thinking. Your Word tells us that the natural man does not receive the things of the Spirit.^c Let light shine powerfully into their minds. Let them be awakened to beliefs that are futile and vain.

What they do may seem right to them but let them see that what is right to man may well be the way of death.^d

Father God, though their devotion and efforts might be futile, they have a heart given to piety. Given so, let this posture of their heart be overturned to serve You instead.

It is time that they walk not according to the course of this world and of the doctrines of men.

It is time they do not live anymore in ignorance of Your grace and mercy. Hence, let them come to repentance. Let it be the time now for them to call upon the name of Jesus and be saved!

STRATEGIC PRAYER

Dear Heavenly Father,

Father God, let him come to appreciate that his destiny is of greater importance than the place where his urn is to be located.

Notwithstanding his sentiments, let him come to see that while one's urn might be placed near to that of a loved one, that is where the shared space ends. There are matters beyond that need further consideration.

Let him come to see also that reality is not what he perceives, that having one's urn besides a loved one does not imply that one will be with the departed loved one thereafter.

Therefore, let not the location of the urn become a barrier for him. Rather let him see that wherever one's ashes may be, the destiny of the dead is a matter of greater consideration. Besides let him see also that it doesn't matter if his urn remains there or otherwise, that such observation and doctrines of men will one day perish.^a

Hence grant him the sense of peace that he could still leave the urn there and hence cross over the barrier to faith in Jesus. Let him see that what matters more is to have his life hidden with Christ in God.^b

Father God, let him come to see your great and wonderful promise that someday that which is corruptible will be clothed with incorruption and that which is mortal will be clothed with immortality.^c

Therefore, let him appreciate that beyond the matter of the urn, a great destiny awaits those who place their faith in Jesus. In that regard, let light shine and bring him to the place of understanding and have him liberated to faith in Christ.

Cause them to understand that consequences can also happen as a result of one's negligence, carelessness, bad decisions, bad influences, lack of self care and a host of other reasons.

Let them see that there is more than what meets the eyes; that we do not have the full knowledge of why bad things happen to certain individuals.

Instead of them focusing on the bad things, let them come to see that You

are the God who is good, just and righteous. You will not do that which contradicts Your character.

I pray for their misconception to be sufficiently addressed, that they would come to the place of enlightenment.

Let them come to the path of Christians who can speak in a manner that would help them understand and see things in better perspectives.

Let them come to see too that while bad things may happen to Christians, You are able to turn the bad for a cause that would work out for their good.

Where there are no apparent reasons why certain believers go through trials, and where these believers are holding fast to You, open the pre-believers' eyes to see that there is something unique about their response that speaks about Your reality in their lives.^b

B. CRAFTING AND SHARING YOUR LIFE STORY¹

Objective

Craft and share your life story using personal illustrations and your driving force

Resource: Video will be available at http://www.celebrationofhope.sg/

A. DOS FOR WRITING YOUR LIFE STORY

- Ask the Lord for wisdom and guidance. The reason we need to seek the Lord is because your story is not just yours; it is God's story lived out through us.
- 2. Write a dangerous life story vulnerable, specific, and of great impact
- 3. Use specific illustrations that have high impact. If your story shows your vulnerability, you can touch the other person more effectively.
- 4. Stay within your time limit. You should tell your story in 3 minutes or less.
- 5. Be realistic. Don't imply that Christ removes all of life's problems. Instead, emphasize that He gives you the strength and obedience to cope with problems.
- 6. Use appropriate illustrations. You may have many illustrations to share, but choose only the ones that are appropriate for your audience.
- Avoid using biblical words (Christianese) such as saved, converted or sin. These words, if not explained carefully, can sound strange and intimidating to non-Christians. If you want to say you grew up in a Christian home, say instead that you had a religious upbringing.

B. 3 COMPONENTS OF A LIFE STORY

C. WRITING YOUR LIFE STORY

1. Your Life Before Christ

This part of your life focuses on your life before you began your relationship with Christ. You can talk about what was important to you, your attitudes, needs and problems.

Think about the driving force in your life:

- anger or resentment
- fear
- guilt
- materialism
- need for approval

Next, share an illustration. You should be able to think of many examples from your life but choose only one to illustrate your life story. You will refer to this illustration again in the last part of your life story.

a. Your Driving Force

b. Your Illustration



2. How You Came to Christ

The second part of your story focuses on how you came to Christ. If you became a Christian as an adult, it should be pretty clear. However if you grew up in a Christian home, this may be more challenging. Although you have known Christ for most of your life, think about the turning point in your walk with God.

3. Your Life Since Coming to Christ

The final part of your story focuses on how your life changed after you came to Christ or after Christ changed that area in your life. Your relationship with God is so important that you should point to something that changed as a result. You should also refer back to the illustration in the first part of your story. For example, if you were driven by anger, how has knowing God helped you to deal with your anger?



D. TRANSITIONING TO YOUR LIFE STORY

Now that you have written your life story, the next step is to learn how to make a smooth transition to your story. Here is an example of a transition statement that you may want to use:

"Tim, you know I'm a Christian but I have not been able to explain my spiritual journey. Recently I have been working on developing my life story, putting significant life events together in a 3-minute version. I would like to buy you coffee and get your opinion on it. Do you have some time this week?"

E. TWO-BY-TWO PRACTICE

- 1. Begin with a transition statement, then launch into your life story.
- After the first person is done, the second person should do the same as above.

Example:

"The Bible tells me that God is love and whoever lives in love lives in God, and God in them. I came from a big family of 13. I don't really have much emotional connection with my father. However, when I heard that God is love and He loves, I was interested to know God and experience His love."

Transition Statement to Division Symbol:

"Why is it that most of us cannot experience God's love?"



2. Division Symbol: I have sinned

a. Read Romans 3:23 and write it out in your own words

b. Explain the second point in your own way and with a personal example

Example:

"The relationship between God and man is broken because of sin. Sin means "missing the mark." I miss God's standard by finding love and acceptance in other people and my achievements."

Transition Statement to Cross Symbol:

We don't have to stay separated from God forever. We can experience His love and live the kind of life that He intended.





3. Cross Symbol: Jesus Died for Me

a. Read John 3:16 and write it out in your own words

b. Explain the third point in your own way and with a personal example

Example:

"God loves me and gave Jesus to me to take my place. I have sinned against God and ought to be punished for my sins. But Jesus took my place instead to be punished for my sins, so that I am forgiven by my God. It's like I owed someone \$5 million, and I can't pay at all. But my friend came to my creditor and paid him back the \$5 million."

Transition Statement to Question Mark Symbol:

Just knowing the three points above is not enough, we have to make a decision.





4. Question Mark Symbol: Will I Choose to Follow Jesus?a. Read John 1:12 and write it out in your own words

b. Explain the fourth point in your own way and with a personal example

Example:

"God forgave my sins and He offered to receive me as His child. What a privilege! If Jesus were standing in front of you right now asking if you would start a personal relationship with Him, what would you say?"

- Conduct follow-up sessions with new or existing believers

A. INITIATING FOLLOW-UP SESSION

1. For New/Existing Believers

- Using the illustration of developing a relationship to encourage a new believer for follow-up
- What other illustrations can you think of to motivate a new believer for follow-up?
- Why do you think it is important to set up the first follow-up session with a new believer as soon as possible?

"Tim, let's say, if we just got to know each other today and became friends. But we don't keep contact with each other after today. Do you think our friendship will grow?

It is the same with your relationship with God. You have just begun a relationship with God today/recently. If you don't continue to develop this relationship, you will not grow to know Him better. I would like to help you develop your relationship with God, is that ok with you? "

ENGAGE!



Take note:

- a. Make them aware of their need to grow in their relationship with God
- b. Set up appointment immediately to meet for the first follow-up session
- c. Arrange a specific time and place to meet.
- d. Ask the believer to review the gospel message (e.g. the Four Spiritual Laws) before you meet again and to thank Christ once more for coming into their lives.

B. CONDUCTING THE FIRST FOLLOW-UP SESSION (BEGINNING YOUR NEW LIFE IN CHRIST)

BEGINNING THE SESSION

1. Have a clear objective for the first session

- a. The objective of the first session is to make sure the new believer has the assurance of Christ's indwelling presence.
- b. Your objective is not just to cover the content of the lesson, but to help the new believer understand biblical principles.

2. Build rapport with the new believer

- a. Ask how things have been since you last met
 - Allow the believer to share
 - Ask if he/she has read the gospel tract (e.g. The FOUR tract)
 - Ask if he/she has thanked Christ for coming into his/her life
 - Respond to any questions
- b. As needs are expressed, share your own experiences and answers from God's Word. Share how God has worked in your life.


DURING THE SESSION

1. Go through Follow-Up Session #1 on Beginning Your New Life in Christ

- a. Read the question
- b. Look up verses in the Bible and read them
- c. Re-read the question
- d. Let the new believer answer the question. Discuss if necessary.
- e. Re-state the answer correctly
- f. Allow the believer to write the answer

2. Create an environment that encourages spiritual growth

- a. Be understanding towards new believer
 - Many concepts might be foreign and he/she might need more time to digest and understand new spiritual concepts.
 - Explain Christian terms if you use them (e.g. justification)
- b. Encourage the believer to ask questions.
 - How can you create an environment that encourages people to ask questions?

3. Take time to listen to the new believer and be attentive to the leading of the Holy Spirit during the appointment.



ENDING THE SESSION

1. Be relaxed but attentive to the person's needs.

- Be aware of the time. If the person has other obligations to keep, cut the time short.
- The new believer will probably be more open to talk about personal problems and interests now than before the lesson. Be open and ready. Do not hurry away if the person wants to take more time.
- 2. Let the new believer know that you enjoyed your time together. Communicate your desire to meet again to talk more about God and the Christian life.

3. Set a specific time and place for the second follow-up appointment.

- If you have a number of people who are ready for Follow-up #2, meet with them as a group.
- Personal follow-up is a bridge to group follow-up. Without the support of a group of disciples, very few Christians grow to spiritual maturity. It is important to involve new believers with other Christians because many of their friends might be non-Christians.

4. Close in prayer.

- Keep your prayer simple. Why?
- Encourage the new believer to pray if he/she is nervous, reassure him/her that God sees our hearts and is not concerned with our words as much as He is with the attitude of our hearts. Explain that prayer is just talking with God, just as we would with a good friend – no eloquent words needed.

Two-by-Two Practice

- One person be the Christian who leads the follow-up session, the other person be the new believer
- Establish rapport and then go through the session (for practice purposes, go through 2-3 questions in the session)
- Use the principles mentioned above
- Close the session
- Switch roles

Beginning Your New Life With Christ

Every Christian can have the assurance that a right relationship exists between himself and God. Without this confidence, it is impossible for one to experience true happiness and complete fulfillment in life.

The moment that you, as an act of faith, receive Jesus Christ into your life to be your Lord and Savior, He comes in. This is what He promises in Revelation 3: 20 and Romans 10:10.

Behold, I stand at the door and knock; if anyone hears My voice and opens the door, I will come in to him and will dine with him, and he with Me. - Revelation 3:20

For it is with your heart that you believe and are justified, and it is with your mouth that you profess your faith and are saved. - Romans 10:10

Have you received Christ into your life in this way? If so, where is Jesus Christ right now in relation to you? On the basis of Revelation 3:20, how do you know that Christ is in your life?

Now that you have received Jesus Christ into your life, you have established a personal relationship with Him.

You have now become a true Christian. You do not become a Christian by living a good life or by being born into a Christian family. The word "Christian" means "Christ in one" - Christ living in you. The Bible tells us that many things happen when Christ comes to live in you.



A New Relationship

Romans 1:4 ...who was declared the Son of God with power by the resurrection from the dead, according to the Spirit of holiness, Jesus Christ our Lord.

- 1. What does the resurrection prove to us about Jesus Christ? (Romans 1:4)
- Who is Jesus Christ? (1 John 5:20) And we know that the Son of God has come, and has given us understanding so that we may know Him who is true; and we are in Him who is true, in His Son Jesus Christ. This is the true God and eternal life. -1 John 5:20
- What would be the result for us if Christ had not risen from the dead? (1 Corinthians 15: 13-17)

But if there is no resurrection of the dead, not even Christ has been raised; and if Christ has not been raised, then our preaching is vain, your faith also is vain. Moreover we are even found to be false witnesses of God, because we testified against God that He raised Christ, whom He did not raise, if in fact the dead are not raised. For if the dead are not raised, not even Christ has been raised; and if Christ has not been raised, your faith is worthless; you are still in your sins. -1 Corinthians 15: 13-17

FOLLOW-UP TWO

Beginning Your New Life Of Fellowship With Christ

Every Christian can experience fellowship with God moment by moment as he learns to confess sin in his life. To live in fellowship with Jesus Christ is to experience a full and abundant life.

When you received Jesus Christ, you established a personal relationship with Him. You became a child of God (John 1:12). You received His life so now you bear His name "Christian".

A common question that many Christians ask is, "What happens when I sin and do things that are displeasing to God?" In other words, "Is my relationship broken? Does Jesus leave my life?"

The answer to this question can best be understood if we distinguish between our relationship to God and our fellowship with God.

Relationship

We can illustrate the difference between our relationship to God and our

fellowship with God by the father-son relationship in a human family. When a boy is born into a family, he is the son of his father's life in him. He then bears his father's name.

Let's suppose the son decides to leave his home and does many things to disgrace his father. Is he still his father's son?

The relationship of the father and son is permanent. This relationship exists regardless of the behaviour of the son.

Fellowship

However, what would happen to their fellowship? Because of the action of the son, their fellowship has been broken. What must the son do to restore their fellowship? The son must go to his father, admitting he is wrong and asking for forgiveness.

Let us relate this illustration to our relationship with God. Our relationship with God, our Father, is permanent. We are His children. This relationship never changes. But when we sin and do things that are displeasing to God, our fellowship is broken. So, in order for our fellowship with God to be restored, we must tell Him that we have been wrong and accept His forgiveness.



We can illustrate the differences in our relationship with God by these three circles.

The carnal man is a Christian who is living a self-directed life because of sin.

The carnal man in circle No. 3 can restore his fellowship with God by confessing his sin. Confession involves three things: agreeing, thanking and repenting.

When we confess, we **AGREE** with God that He has revealed to us as sin is sin. We also **THANK** God that our sin has been paid for by Jesus Christ's death on the cross. Confession also involves **REPENTANCE**. Repentance is a change of attitude which will result in a change of action.

The Christian needs to understand that when he sins and takes over the direction of his life once again, he should immediately confess his sin and God will restore him to fellowship.

Beginning Your New Life In The Holy Spirit

Everyday can be an exciting adventure for the Christian who knows the reality of being filled with the Holy Spirit and who lives constantly, moment by moment, under His gracious control.

For three years the disciples had walked, worked and talked with Jesus. They knew Him, trusted Him and loved Him. On one particular night, however, Jesus told His disciples some very upsetting news: He would soon die.

Put yourself in the disciples' place. How would you feel? Confused? Frightened? Helpless? They probably did, too.

But then imagine hearing Jesus tell you, as a result of His going to be with God the Father, another friend would come -one who would be with you, one who would be in you.

The friend who was to come is the Holy Spirit. An amazing thing that Jesus told His followers was that the Holy Spirit would reside in them. Even better, He would "be with them forever". Imagine the encouragement this offered to these individuals. God would make His home within the lives of those people who would love and receive Him.

In this way, the disciples would not be left with the impossible tasks of trying to imitate the character of Christ and attempting to continue His mission. Instead, through the Holy Spirit, the very life of Christ with all His character, authority and strength could be lived through their individual lives and personalities.



Twenty centuries later, Christ's promise still remains true. He offers hope to those who are trying to live as He lived. Anyone who has sincerely attempted to reach that goal knows that, worthy as it is, it is a hopeless ideal. Only Jesus Christ can act like Jesus Christ.

And that, of course, is the uniqueness of Christianity. Instead of frustrating us with the inevitable failure of attempting to live up to impossibly high ethical, moral and spiritual standards, the only Person who ever perfectly fulfilled all those standards offers to do it again - through each of us. Once Jesus has entered into a life, that person has the potential to let Him live out His life in and through him. This is available to anyone!

It sounds good, doesn't it? The obvious question is, how can I experience the resurrected Christ living His life through me? The following will help to explain.

Receiving Jesus Christ as personal Lord and Saviour is the most important decision in life. The act of receiving Jesus Christ by faith starts a whole new life. Just as physical life requires air, food, rest and exercise, so spiritual life has its requirements for growth and development.

The moment you receive Christ, you were born into God 's family and you received everything you need to live the abundant Christian life. Spiritual growth results from trusting Jesus Christ. FOLLOW-UP FIVE

Beginning Your New Life In God's Word

The Bible is God's inspired Word to man. He has something to say to you. Much of the adventure of the Christian life comes from discovering through the Bible more of what God is like and what His plans are for you.

Throughout history God has desired to communicate with the people of His creation. Before Jesus came, God spoke to and through the committed people of the Old Testament who recorded His Word. God then sent His Word to earth personally, in the person of Jesus Christ (John 1:14). While Jesus was on earth, as well as after His death and resurrection, God again directed committed men to record the words and ministry of the Son of God. The results of their faithfulness and availability is the New Testament.

The Bible is the entire record of God's communication to us. It has been given to us by God who desires our fellowship and worship.

Learning To Listen To God

The Bible is the most important book one could read. Many people do not know how to listen to what God is saying to them in His Word. A meaningful relationship with the Lord is dependent on hearing and understanding what He is sharing with us. Following are some hints to help you begin your study of God's Word.

Understanding that reading the Bible is not like reading any other book. The Bible is God's inspired Word to man. In this book, God has something to say to you. Therefore, read with the attitude, "Lord, this is Your personal letter of



love and instruction to me. Help me to understand and obey Your counsel and commands."

Preparation

In addition to the Bible, you will need a pen or pencil, paper and a quiet place to study. Pray and ask the Holy Spirit to guide you in your study. Your study will normally involve three steps: Observation, Interpretation and Application.

I. OBSERVATION

In this step you observe in order to find out what the passage says. You may need to read the passage several times or you may wish to write out the passage concentrating on "What does the passage say?"

II. INTERPRETATION

The second step involves the question, "What does this passage mean?" Ask: "What does it say about God and man?"

III. APPLICATION

In this step you ask the question, "How does this passage apply to my life?" You may ask the following questions:

- Is there a command to obey?
- Is there a promise to claim?
- Is there **sin** to confess?
- Is there an **attitude** to change?
- Is there an **example** to follow?

Here is an example of how to follow the three steps using 1 Peter 5:7:

Beginning Your New Life In Prayer

Prayer is talking with God. Every Christian has the privilege of communicating directly with God. If we desire a vital and fulfilling Christian life, we need to learn to talk with God. Through prayer, we can appropriate all of God's resources for us in Jesus Christ.

Any fulfilling relationship involves two-way communication. A look at the biographies of people recorded in the Bible clearly shows the importance of communication between God and His people. As long as these individuals listened to God, obeyed Him and prayed, their spiritual lives were radiant. When these same people, however, failed to hear and obey God and talk with Him through prayer, spiritual problems crowded in.

The same thing can happen to us today. God communicates with us through His Word, the Bible. If we desire a rich and fulfilling Christian life, we also need to learn to talk with God. To pray is simply to converse or talk with Him.

Prayer was an important emphasis in the life of Jesus Christ. His desire to seek His Father's presence and know His will through prayer is apparent throughout His earthly life. The life of Christ was a living conversation with God the Father; prayer was the backbone of Christ's life and ministry. To become like Christ, we need to learn to pray.

Prayer should include the following elements: Worship and Praise, Thanksgiving, Confession, and Specific Requests.



Worship And Praise God
