


Cain's anger stemmed from a perceived injustice

<sup>13</sup> And you say, 'What a burden!' and you sniff at it contemptuously,' says the LORD Almighty.


"When you bring injured, lame or diseased animals and offer them as sacrifices, should I accept them from your hands?" says the LORD.

### Isaiah 2:12


For the LORD of hosts will have a day of reckoning







→ A Better Way – The Faith of Abel

### Hebrews 11: 1-4

<sup>1</sup> Now faith is confidence in what we hope for and assurance about what we do not see. <sup>2</sup> This is what the ancients were commended for.

<sup>3</sup> By faith we understand that the universe was formed at God's command, so that what is seen was not made out of what was visible.

<sup>4</sup> By faith Abel brought God a better offering than Cain did. By faith he was commended as righteous, when God spoke well of his offerings. And by faith Abel still speaks, even though he is dead.

Unlike his father and brother, Abel chose a different path



In Genesis 3:17-19, God declared:

"Cursed is the ground because of you; through painful toil you will eat food from it all the days of your life. <sup>18</sup> It will produce thorns and thistles for you, and you will eat the plants of the field. 19 By the sweat of your brow you will eat your food until you return to the ground, since from it you were taken; for dust you are and to dust you will return."

Jesus considered Abel a prophet


### Hebrews 11: 4




## What has faith got to do with humility?


Faith is in and of itself, an act of humility  $\rightarrow$  to trust in Christ's finished work on the cross, and not on our own works to redeem ourselves.
