

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26 For if we go on **sinning** willfully <u>after receiving the</u> <u>knowledge of the truth</u>, there no longer remains a sacrifice for sins, 27 <u>but</u> a <u>terrifying expectation</u> of <u>judgment</u> and the <u>fury of a fire</u> which will consume the adversaries.

28 Anyone who has set aside the Law of Moses dies without mercy on the testimony of two or three witnesses.

29 How much <u>severer punishment</u> do you think he will deserve who has trampled under foot the Son of God, and has regarded as unclean the blood of the covenant by which he was sanctified, and has insulted the Spirit of grace?

30 For we know Him who said, "<u>Vengeance is Mine, I</u> <u>will repay</u>." And again, <u>"The Lord will judge His</u> <u>people</u>." 31 It is a <u>terrifying thing</u> to fall into the hands of the living God. <u>How Not</u> to fall away: V26-31
