Interpretation






Hebrews 9 - The Old and the New


1Now even the first covenant had regulations of divine worship and the earthly sanctuary 2For there was a tabernacle prepared, the outer one in which were the lampstand and the table and the sacred bread; this is called the holy place 3Behind the second veil there was a tabernacle which is called the Holy of Holies 4having a golden altar of incense and the ark of the covenant covered on all sides with gold, in which was a golden jar holding the manna, and Aaron's rod which budded, and the tables of the covenant 5 and above it were the cherubim of glory overshadowing the mercy seat but of these things we cannot now speak in detail. 6Now when these things have been so prepared, the priests are continually entering the outer tabernacle performing the divine worship, 7but into the second, only the high priest enters once year, not without taking blood which he offers for himself and for the sins of the people committed in ignorance. 8The Holy Spirit is signifying this, that the way into the holy place has not yet been disclosed while the outer tabernacle is still **standing** 9which is a symbol for the present time. Accordingly both gifts and sacrifices are offered which cannot make the worshiper perfect in conscience 10since they relate only to food and drink and various washings, regulations for the body imposed until a time of reformation.





Lev 16:11 "Then Aaron shall offer the bull of the sin offering which is for himself and make atonement for himself and for his household, and he shall slaughter the bull of the sin offering which is for himself. 12 He shall take a firepan full of coals of fire from upon the altar before the Lord and two handfuls of finely ground sweet incense, and bring it inside the veil. 13 He shall put the incense on the fire before the Lord, that the **cloud of incense may cover the** mercy seat that is on the ark of the testimony, otherwise he will die. 14 Moreover, he shall take some of the blood of the bull and sprinkle it with his finger on the **mercy seat** on the east side; also in front of the **mercy seat** he shall sprinkle some of the blood with his finger seven times.



11But when Christ appeared as a high priest of the good things to come, He entered through the greater and more perfect tabernacle not made with hands, that is to say not of this creation 12and not through the blood of goats and calves, but through His own blood He entered the holy place once for all, having obtained eternal redemption. 13For if the blood of goats and bulls and the ashes of a heifer sprinkling those who have been defiled sanctify for the cleansing of the flesh 14how much more will the blood of Christ, who through the eternal Spirit offered Himself without blemish to God, cleanse your conscience from dead works to serve the living God?

V 15-28 Fundamental

15For this reason He is the mediator of a **new covenant**, so that, since a **death** has taken place for the redemption of the transgressions that were committed under the **first covenant**, those who have been called may receive the promise of the eternal inheritance.

16For where a covenant is, there must of necessity be the death of the one who made it. 17For a covenant is valid only when men are dead, for it is never in force while the one who made it lives. 18Therefore even the first covenant was not inaugurated without **blood**. 19For when every commandment had been spoken by Moses to all the people according to the Law, he took the blood of the calves and the goats, with water and scarlet wool and hyssop, and sprinkled both the book itself and all the people, 20saying, "THIS IS THE BLOOD OF THE COVENANT WHICH GOD COMMANDED YOU." 21And in the same way he sprinkled both the tabernacle and all the vessels of the ministry with the **blood**. 22And according to the Law, one may almost say, all things are cleansed with blood, and without shedding of blood there is no forgiveness.

23Therefore it was necessary for the copies of the things in the heavens to be cleansed with these, but the heavenly things themselves with better sacrifices than these. 24For Christ did not enter a holy place made with hands, a mere copy of the true one, but into heaven itself, now to appear in the presence of God for us; 25nor was it that He would offer Himself often, as the high priest enters the holy place year by year with blood that is not his own. 260therwise, He would have needed to suffer often since the foundation of the world; but now once at the consummation of the ages He has been manifested to put away sin by the sacrifice of Himself. 27And inasmuch as it is appointed for men to die once and after this comes judgment, 28so Christ also, having been offered once to bear the sins of many, will appear a second time for salvation without reference to sin, to those who eagerly await Him.







The altar and sacrifices were absolutely central to the religion of Israel. Implicit in the sacrificial system is the idea of substitution — the offering of an unblemished animal to atone (provide a covering) for the guilt of the sinner. All the sacrifices pointed to the Messiah who would one day offer himself as the perfect sacrifice to provide atonement for sin. Eight hundred years before the coming of Christ Isaiah prophesied: We all, like sheep, have gone astray, each of us has turned to his own way; and the LORD has laid on him the iniquity of us all.


Take a moment to thank God: For His love.

the Word of God; and sanctification, (or separation)




Eph5:26"Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ also loved the church and gave Himself for her, that He might sanctify and cleanse her with the washing of water by the word"

Table of Shewbread

Exodus 25:23-30

There were 12 loaves of bread (Exodus 25:30; Leviticus 24:5-9)
The bread was replaced every Sabbath (1 Chronicles 9:32)
The people made manna (Numbers 11:8)
"I am the bread of life" (John 6:35, 48, 49-51, 58)
"I am the living bread" (John 6:51)
"Unless you eat the flesh of the Son of God" (John 6:53)
Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every Word...
(Deuteronomy 8:3, Matthew 4:4, Luke 4:4)

- 7. The Spirit of the Fear of the Lord




Receive the 7-fold ministry of the Holy Spirit into your life. Eg I receive the Spirit of the Lord...

The Golden Altar of Incense of the Tabernacle

- The <u>incense</u> was to be left burning continually throughout the day and night as a pleasing aroma to the Lord
- The incense was a symbol of the prayers and intercession of the people going up to God as a sweet fragrance.
- God wanted His dwelling to be a place where people could approach Him and pray to Him.
- The golden altar, furthermore, is a representation of Christ, who is our intercessor before God the Father.

- It first contained the Tables of the Law, originally engraven by the hand of God
- It then also contained a pot of manna (the bread from God)
- And Aaron's rod that budded, demonstrating Yahweh's power and authority, choosing the High Priest
- All types of Christ: his total obedience (God given law), the true bread from heaven (John 6:32-33) and God's chosen High Priest (Hebrews 7:15-17)
