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11 Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen.

2 For by it the men of old gained approval.

3 By faith we understand that the worlds were prepared by the word of God, so that what is seen was not made out of things which are visible. 4 By faith Abel offered to God a better sacrifice Illustrations of faith than Cain, through which he obtained the testimony that he was righteous, God testifying about his gifts, and through faith, though he is dead, he still speaks. 5 By faith **Enoch** was taken up so that he would not see death; and he was not found because God took him up; for he obtained the witness that before his being taken up he was pleasing to God. 6 And without faith it is impossible to please Him, for he who comes to God must believe that He is and that He is a rewarder of those who seek Him. 7 By faith Noah, being warned by God about things not yet seen, in reverence prepared an ark for the salvation of his household, by which he condemned the world, and became an heir of the righteousness which is according to faith.

Culture of the time

Canaanite culture, within which Abraham lived, promoted the norms of sacrifice children to gods (Molech or Baal)

If you love God, you will proveby sacrificing your child.



4 observations:

- —It was meant to be a test to change Abraham ie awe at God's promise.
- Test ended when Abraham made the choice to act ie raised the knife.
- "Now I know.." = refers not "to knowing existing fact" but to THE new & expressed affection.
- A faith act resulted in birth of nation of Israel and paved the way for the Savior of the world.

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27 By faith he left Egypt, not fearing the wrath of the king; for he endured, as seeing Him who is unseen. 28 By faith he kept the Passover and the sprinkling of the blood, so that he who destroyed the firstborn would not touch them. 29 By faith they passed through the Red Sea as though they were passing through dry land; and the Egyptians, when they attempted it, were drowned.

Moses – Faith seen in his choice (v23-29)


