Intro to Messianic Psalms

Messianic Psalms and the Nature of Prophecy

Before we begin, however, we need to define what we mean by a "Messianic Psalm." There are two alternatives:

Narrow sense. This view sees a messianic psalm as prophetic and having **no direct message** of significance to the Old Testament period; they **only predict** the coming Messiah.

General sense. Psalms that anticipate the Messiah but also have meaning in a contemporary context of the writer.

Some psalms are prophetic of the Messiah Jesus. Given under the inspiration of the Spirit, they sometimes *speak about concepts* and persons beyond the author's knowledge and understanding.

Psalm 22

The psalmist apparently felt forsaken by God, as he was surrounded by his enemies' scornful persecution. He lamented his tremendous suffering and his desperate struggle with death, pleading with God to deliver him from such a horrible end. Apparently his prayer was answered, for he was able to declare to the elect and to the world that the Lord answered his prayer.

No known incident in the life of David fits the details of this psalm.

This means that David used many poetic expressions to portray his immense sufferings, but these poetic words became literally true of the suffering of Jesus Christ at His enemies' hands.

The interesting feature of this psalm is that it does not include one word of confession of sin, and no imprecation against enemies. It is primarily the account of a righteous man who was being put to death by wicked men.

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



Sheep are especially troubled by the nose fly. These little flies buzz about the sheep's head, attempting to deposit their eggs on the damp mucous membranes of the sheep's nose. If they are successful, the eggs will hatch in a few days to form worm-like larvae. They work their way up the nasal passages into the sheep's head; they burrow into the flesh and there set up an intense irritation accompanied by severe inflammation.



For relief from this agonizing annoyance sheep will deliberately beat their heads against trees, rocks, posts, or brush. In extreme cases of intense infestation, a sheep may even kill itself. Often advanced stages of infection from these flies will lead to blindness.

All this excitement and distraction has a devastating effect on the entire flock. The ewes will go off milking, and their lambs will stop growing gainfully. Some sheep will be injured in their headlong rushes of panic; others may be blinded and some even killed outright.



At the very first sign of flies among the flock, a shepherd will apply an antidote to their heads. The remedy is composed of linseed oil, sulphur, and tar, which is smeared over the sheep's nose and head as a protection against nose flies.

What an incredible transformation this would make among the sheep. Once the oil had been applied to the sheep's head, there is an immediate change in behaviour. Gone was the aggravation, irritability and restlessness. Instead, the sheep would start to feed quietly again, then soon lie down in peaceful contentment.



Just as with the sheep, there must be continuous and renewed application of oil to forestall the "flies" in our life; there must be a continuous anointing of God's gracious Spirit to counteract the ever-present aggravations of personality conflicts. Only one application of oil, sulphur, and tar was not enough for the entire summer It is a process that has to be repeated. The fresh application is an effective antidote.

Reflection By My Mentor:

Psalm 22-24 form a profound trilogy.

(Now this question came to me in a holy whisper!)

TRY reading it again.. slowly..

.. IN A WHISPER!

"WHO shall ascend the hill of the LORD? And who shall STAND in his HOLY place?" (Psalm 24:3)

"Me, Lord, I WANT!"

"ME, Lord", my soul cried out.

By the move of the Holy Spirit, I was inexplicably drawn.. by a hunger for God.. deep within.. for a deeper intimacy.. with God.

- As the psalm continues with GOD's holy requirement (v.4)
- Psalm 24:4 "He who has clean hands and a pure heart, who does not lift up his soul to what is false (empty, futile, worthless) and does not swear deceitfully."
- "Clean hands and pure heart" are simple words but a very tall order! I stood convicted.
- "Oh no, Lord, WHO then can ascend.. and stand..??!!"
- Woe is me for I am undone!
