Mark 6:31-44

Matthew 14:13-21

Luke 9:12-17

John 6:1-14

When Jesus heard what had happened, he and the apostles withdrew by boat privately to a solitary place. But many who saw them leaving recognized them and ran on foot from all the towns and got there ahead of them.

When Jesus landed and saw a large crowd, he had compassion on them, because they were like sheep without a shepherd. He welcomed them and began teaching about the kingdom of God, and healed those who needed healing.

As evening approached, the disciples came to him and said, “This is a remote place, and it’s already getting late. Send the crowds away, so they can go to the villages and buy themselves some food.”

Jesus replied, “They do not need to go away. You give them something to eat.”

When they had all had enough to eat, he said to his disciples, “Gather the pieces that are left over. Let nothing be wasted.” So they gathered them and filled twelve baskets with the pieces of the five barley loaves left over by those who had eaten.

The number of those who ate was about five thousand men, besides women and children.






