

No condemnation. Only encouragement!



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CONDEMNATION IS ...

Being judgmental, strong disapproval, censure, finding guilty, writing off

BUT DOESN'T THE BIBLE CALL US TO JUDGE BELIEVERS?

1 Corinthians 5:12 "It isn't your responsibility to judge outsiders, but it certainly is your responsibility to judge those inside church who are sinning."



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THERE IS JUDGMENT, AND THERE IS JUDGMENT

Judgment among believers = discernment of sin, not to condemn, but to bring them to a place of awareness and repentance.

JAMES 5:19-20 "If one of you should wander from the truth and someone should bring that person back, remember this: Whoever turns a sinner from the error of their way will save them from death and cover over a multitude of sins."



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THE PROBLEM WITH CONDEMNATION

Jesus doesn't condemn (John 3:17)! What gives us the right to write anyone off? Even when we sin, grace and forgiveness abound! (Romans 8:1)

Romans 8:33-35 Who will bring any charge against those whom God has chosen? It is God who justifies. Who then is the one who condemns? No one. Christ Jesus who died—more than that, who was raised to life—is at the right hand of God and is also interceding for us. Who shall separate us from the love of Christ?

Romans 14:4 Who are you to pass judgment on the servant of another? It is before his own master that he stands or falls.



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THE PROBLEM WITH CONDEMNATION

James 3:13 Judgment without mercy will be shown to anyone who has not been merciful. Mercy triumphs over judgment.

Matthew 7:1-5 "Do not judge, or you too will be judged. For in the same way you judge others, you will be judged, and with the measure you use, it will be measured to you. Why do you look at the speck of sawdust in your brother's eye and pay no attention to the plank in your own eye? You hypocrite, first take the plank out of your own eye, and then you will see clearly to remove the speck from your brother's eye."

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HE ENCOURAGES US, AND BIDS US TO BE ENCOURAGERS TOO

Ephesians 4:29 Let no corrupting talk come out of your mouths, but only such as is good for **building up**, as fits the occasion, that it may **give grace** to those who hear.

Romans 15:1-2 We who are strong ought to bear with the failings of the weak and not to please ourselves. Each of us should please our neighbours for their good, to build them up.

1 Thessalonians 5:11 Therefore encourage one another and build one another up, just as you are doing.



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Acts 4 V

Thus Joseph, who was also called by the apostles Barnabas (which means 'son of encouragement), a Levite, a native of Cyprus, ³⁷ sold a field that belonged to him and brought the money and "laid it at the apostles' feet.


Acts 9 V

Saul in Jerusalem

²⁶ And ¹ when he had come to Jerusalem, he attempted to join the disciples. And they were all afraid of him, for they did not believe that he was a disciple. ²⁷ But ¹⁶ Barnabas took him and ¹⁶ brought him to the apostles and declared to them ¹⁶ how on the road he had seen the Lord, who spoke to him, and ²⁶ how at Damascus he had ¹⁶ preached boldly in the name of Jesus. ²⁸ So he went ²⁶ in and out among them at Jerusalem, preaching boldly in the name of the Lord. ²⁹ And he spoke and disputed against ²⁶ the Hellenists. ³

- 1. Jacob & Esau. Esau held a grudge against Jacob because of the blessing their father Isaac had given him. "The days of mourning for my father are near; then I will kill my brother Jacob." (Gen 27:41)
- 2. Leah & Rachel. "Surely my husband will love me now." (Gen 29:32)
- 3. Prodigal son & brother. "All these years I've been slaving for you and never disobeyed your orders. Yet you never gave me even a young goat so I could celebrate with my friends. But when this son of yours who has squandered your property with prostitutes comes home, you kill the fattened calf for him!" (Luke 15:29-30)



Saul was very angry; this refrain displeased him greatly. "They have credited David with tens of thousands," he thought, "but me with only thousands." 1 Sam 18:7-8




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David & Jonathan

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WHAT MIRIAM, AARON & KORAH SAID IN NUMBERS 11-16:

- The people **complained** about their hardships in the hearing of the Lord.
- "Wouldn't it be better for us to go back to Egypt?"
- "Has the Lord spoken only through Moses? Hasn't he also spoken through us? Why then do you set yourselves above us?"
- "We will not come! Isn't it enough that you brought us up out of a land flowing with milk and honey to kill us in the wilderness? Now you also want to lord it over us!"



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THIS MIGHT SOUND LIKE IN MODERN DAY CHURCH ...

- The people **complained** about their hardships in the hearing of the Lord.
- "Wouldn't it be better for us to visit another church?
- "Has the Lord spoken only through SP? Hasn't he also spoken **through us**?
 Why then do you set yourselves **above us**?"
- "We will not come! Isn't it enough that we sometimes come for service and cell group and occasionally even remember to tithe? Now you also want to lord it over us!"



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NUM 11-16: WHAT DOES GOD THINK OF COMPLAINERS?

- "The anger of the Lord burned against them, and he left them."
- "I have heard the complaints of these grumbling Israelites.
 How long will this wicked community grumble against me?
 How long will these people treat me with contempt?
 I will strike them down with a plague and destroy them.
 Not one of them will ever see the land I promised on oath to their ancestors. No one who has treated me with contempt will ever see it."



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THE ROOTS OF A COMPLAINING AND CRITICAL POSTURE:

1. PRIDE. Pride says ...

- "If it were me, I'd do it this way."
- "My opinion matters more than yours."
- "Do you know who I am?"
- "Who are you to tell me what to do?!"

2. DISCONTENT. Discontent says ...

- "I don't appreciate what I have ..."
- "... but I'm angry at what I don't have!"
- "I deserve better!"

"Some people complain about tolerate a single complaint about themselves"



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SEE A PROBLEM? INSTEAD OF COMPLAINING AND CRITICISING, LEARN TO HAVE CONSTRUCTIVE CONVERSATIONS

- 1. The aim of any church conversation is to achieve our common goal. It is not to win a debate 🖨
- 2. Speak neutrally. Don't put down, corner, assert, insist, pester, fight ...
- 3. Listen objectively to others' input. Hold your own view lightly.
- 4. No offences. Don't be offensive. Don't be easily offended.
- 5. No defensiveness. Don't assume you're under attack.



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WE ARE CALLED TO BE NOT CRITICAL, BUT CHARITABLE.

TO LOVE, THINK AND HOPE FOR THE BEST OF ONE ANOTHER.

FROM 1 CORINTHIANS 13 ... (In some versions, love = charity)

- 4 Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud.
- 5 It does not dishonour others, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs.
- 6 Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth.
- 7 It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres.
- Charity suffereth long, and is kind; charity envieth not; charity vaunteth not itself, is not puffed
- Doth not behave itself unseemly, seeketh not her own, is not easily provoked, thinketh no
- Rejoiceth not in iniquity, but rejoiceth in the truth:
- Beareth all things, believeth all things, hopeth all things, endureth

- Charity is patient, is kind. Charity does not envy, does not act wrongly, is not inflated.
- Charity is not ambitious, does not seek for itself, is not provoked to anger, devises no evil.
- ⁵ Charity does not rejoice over iniquity, but rejoices in truth.
- Charity suffers all, believes all, hopes all, endures all.
