




What is in the Name of God?

- The Name of God represents His attributes, character, nature, roles, etc.
- God is infinite and man is finite
- Hence, there are different names of God to represent different aspects of His character and roles in His relationship with His people

12 "How you are fallen from heaven, O Lucifer, son of the morning! How you are cut down to the ground, You who weakened the nations!



Genesis 17:1 When Abram was ninety-nine years old, the LORD appeared to Abram and said to him, "I am Almighty God; walk before Me and be blameless.





Before the law was given:

- Job feared God, hated evilJob 1:1
 Th
- Noah walked with God Genesis 6:9
- Abraham believed God
 Genesis 15:6

These three men (Job, Noah, Abraham) were blameless

They were:

- focused on God
- dependent on God by faith
- had right standing with God



Deuteronomy 6:25 (Righteousness in the OT)

Then it will be **righteousness for us**, if we are **careful to observe all these commandments before the Lord** our God, as He has
commanded us.

³ For they being **ignorant of God's righteousness**, and **seeking to establish their own righteousness**, have **not submitted to the righteousness of God**. ⁴ For Christ is the end of the law for righteousness to everyone who believes.

Our response #3: The evidence of our keeping Covenant is circumcision of our hearts

Romans 2:28-29

²⁸ For he is **not** a **Jew** who is one **outwardly**, nor is **circumcision** that which is **outward in the flesh**;
²⁹ but **he is a Jew who is one inwardly**; and **circumcision is that of the heart**, **in the Spirit**, not in the letter; whose praise is not from men but from God.



Our response #3: The evidence of our keeping Covenant is circumcision of our hearts


Acts 7:51 You stiff-necked and uncircumcised in heart and ears! You always resist the Holy Spirit; as your fathers did, so do you.
