MESSAGE SUMMARY

INTRODUCTION

The word “Heart” appears 600 times in the Old Testament. A heart can be clean (Psalm 51:10), pure (Psalm 24:4), cheerful (Proverbs 17:22), or hardened (Proverbs 28:14), broken (Psalm 147:3), contrite (Psalm 51:17). God does not merely look at our appearance but more so at the condition of our heart.

Through Psalms 27, DSP Low Kok Guan led the congregation to reflect on 3 questions that helps to examine a heart that seeks God.

The Great Commission: Get Up - Gear Up – Be Ready!

1) Who do you Lean on? (Psalm 27:1-3; 12-14)

David learnt to lean on God and seek Him in times of need, with confidence that God will see him through. Likewise, we need to learn to lean on God because He is our stronghold. Wicked people may rise against us or tell us lies but we can remain confident that God will deliver us in His way and in His timing.

We may have many fears – fear of lack or failure, fear of losing our jobs, health concerns or marriage challenges. These fears can handicap us and make us lose our anchor. Whenever we are afraid, we need to come before God and ask Him to help us to learn to wait upon Him, trusting that He will answer our prayers.

2) Who do you Long for? (Psalm 27:4-6; 8-11)

David seeks the face of God to know who God is (Psalm 27:8). He longed to dwell in the house of the Lord all the days of his life (Psalm 27:4). He worshipped God in times of trouble and believed that God would help and save him (Psalm 27:6).

3) Who do you Listen to? (Psalm 27:7)

David called upon the Lord and waited for Him to answer his prayers. He must have heard from God and believed in Him to remain strong and courageous while waiting for God to deliver him (Psalm 27:14).

A heart that seeks God is a heart that listens to God. As we ask God to listen to us, we must also be prepared to listen to Him. When we wait and listen to God, we hear the voice of God and know His will for us. So, wait for the Lord and align our will to His today.

CONCLUSION

Seek God and we will find Him faithful. Let us deal with our hearts so that they will be hearts that seek after God - hearts that lean on Him, long for Him, and listen to Him.

For the eyes of the Lord run to and fro throughout the whole earth to strengthen those whose hearts are fully devoted to Him (2 Chronicles 16:9).

QUESTIONS

1. What does it mean to truly seek God for who He is, and not just for what He can do for us? How would you describe your relationship with God – Is it driven by the desire to know Him deeply or the desire for Him to address our needs?

2. What does waiting on God look like in your current season? How can we continue to worship God despite disappointment or pain?

3. Which of the three areas: Leaning on God, Longing for God or Listening to God – do you sense God is calling you to grow in most? What is one practical step that you can take to seek God more deeply in that area?
