MESSAGE SUMMARY

INTRODUCTION

Even if we come together as a church to worship God and as a cell to love one another according to the commandment, Pastor Don Wong shared that our love for God is still not complete. Instead, our love for God will only be completed when we carry out the Great Commission of winning souls for Him, because of the great sacrifice made by Jesus when He died on the cross.

By referencing to the famed movie franchise "Mission Impossible", Pastor Don likened the mission to be completed by the Church through the power and resources given by God.

The Great Commission: Get Up - Gear Up – Be Ready!

1) Awakening of the Soul - Our Walk, Our Worship, Our Work

The Word affirmed that God has given us the power and the authority through the Holy Spirit to carry out the purpose of proclaiming the good news (Acts 1:8). We have been anointed by the Holy Spirit to fulfil our divine calling (Isaiah 61:1-3). As Paul prayed for the eyes of our hearts to be enlightened, we must know of this power given to us by God to minister to the lost (Ephesians 1:18-20). Pastor Don emphasised that the only way to experience this power is through active ministry. There must be an awakening in our souls to understand that God's love has not only saved us for eternity, but also for a purpose. When we carry out this purpose, we can trust that God will make all things good for us according to His ways and plans (Romans 8:28-29).

In 1 Samuel 21, David's request for bread and a sword or spear from Ahimelek allowed him to receive consecrated bread and the sword of Goliath. Both were choices born out of urgency for King Saul's mission. David had earlier defeated Goliath in battle by depending on God instead of King Saul's armour. From these, we are reminded that in our attempts to minister, we ought to go back to the basics of praying, reading the Word and listening to the voice of God. This is because there is a tendency for us to do something for God through worldly methods. We must walk in faith as we serve with our talents and the Holy Spirit will anoint us to do the impossible.

In these uncertain times, we must discern God's timing and see the world through the eyes of Jesus, who sees us as sheep without their shepherd and therefore lost and vulnerable. There must be an awakening of our sleeping hearts to the Biblical urgency (1 Thessalonians). In this world of conflicting

opinions, we must filter them against the Word of God, for His power is found in His Word (Exodus 7:1). By walking in the Spirit and in truth, we will bear fruit that truly glorifies God.

For the awakening of the soul, we need:

1. Worship - God inhabits our praise and silence is broken
2. Prayer - Driven by fire instead of convenience
3. Consecration - Holiness is not outdated
4. Evangelism - Recognising that someone's eternity depends on us
5. Families - An urgent commitment to raise our children on the Word
6. Calling - The initiative to preach, pray and serve

We must act now, because if we do not, the **system** and **values** of the world will **seep** into the next generation.

2) The King's Business Requires Urgency

There must be urgency in our hearts to reach the lost (1 Thessalonians 5:6). The king's business is not optional, not secondary and not a side quest.

We must pray to ask God to open up our eyes and to touch us so that we will not be complacent and take the mission lightly. Much like Tom Cruise, the main character of the famed movie franchise "Mission Impossible", the mission of the church requires the level of urgency that carries the weight of eternal life and death.

CONCLUSION

God has not only saved us for eternity but empowered and provided us with the resources to become the vessels to reach out to the lost. As a church, we should not only grow in our faith but also carry out the Great Commission with urgency. Get up, gear up and be ready!

QUESTIONS

1. Share a time when you shared the Gospel with a non-believer. What approach did you take, and how did it turn out in the end?
